



## 2018-2019 Annual Report Highlights

Fiscal Year 2018-2019 yielded notable accomplishments for the First 5 Commission and positive outcomes for our youngest residents and their families in San Bernardino County. One of the most significant investments by First 5 San Bernardino was the continued building and implementation of a Quality Rating Improvement System (QRIS). For FY 2018-2019 reporting, there were 234 early care and education sites participating. Since launching Quality Start San Bernardino (QSSB) in fiscal year 2015-2016, QSSB participants have made progress in increasing the quality of their programs. Fiscal year 2018-2019 was the program's first year with sites receiving a re-rating. Out of the 60 sites that were rerated, 42 had an increase in their total rating points and 24 had an increase in their overall tier rating.

Site are evaluated based on a tier rating scale ranging from (1) Emerging Quality to (5) Highest Quality. The distribution of tier ratings for FY 2018-2019 are as follows: 14 sites received a tier rating of 5-Highest Quality, 134 received 4-Quality Plus, 21 received 3-Quality, 44 received 2-Rising Quality and 12 1-Emerging Quality. All efforts combined, QSSB was able to ensure that more than 10,102 children benefitted from an overall higher quality early learning environment.

## Other highlights that took place in 2018-2019 were:

- The continued Family and Community Support and Partnerships initiative served 1,029 parents to minimize the risk of child maltreatment
- Career Online High School offered 100 parents of young children the opportunity to complete the requirements to earn a high school diploma online
- Asthma screening, stabilization and education provided to 204 children and their caregivers
- Oral Health Screenings for 9,510 children and 433 pregnant women, education for their families around optimal oral health practice and assistance with the establishment of a dental home
- Successful Literacy, Water Safety and Oral Health Campaigns
- Developmental screenings provided to 3,403 children countywide
