### I. INTRODUCTION

- A. Goal of course
  - 1. To provide theory and practical training to safely and effectively operate Electronic Weapons.
- B. Safety Rules
  - 1. Weapons are to remain on "safe"
  - 2. Point them in a safe direction
  - 3. No firearm permitted in the classroom
  - 4. Activity will stop at call of cease fire

### II. OVERVIEW

- A. Technology of electronic weapons
  - 1. "Taser waves" matching brain waves
  - 2. Tasers effect on the motor nervous system causing NMI
- B. High risk populations with less lethal weapons
  - 1. Pregnant
  - 2. Infirm
  - 3. Elderly
  - 4. Small children
  - 5. Low BMI
- C. Arrest related deaths
  - 1. Pre-existing conditions
  - 2. Individual susceptibility
  - 3. Excited delirium
- D. Nomenclature
  - 1. Trigger
  - 2. ARC switch
  - 3. Power Performance Magazine (PPM)
  - 4. Safety switch
  - 5. Central Image Display (CID)
  - 6. Light
  - 7. Dual lasers
  - 8. Front and rear sights
  - 9. PPM release button
- E. Loading and unloading
  - 1. Weapon on safe

- 2. Pointed in a safe direction
- 3. Body parts away from front of cartridges
- 4. Probes placed in sharps container
- F. Deployment distances
  - 1. 0 to 25 feet
  - 2. Optimal range being 7 to 15 feet
    - a. High hit probability
    - b. Good spread for NMI
    - c. Good reactionary distance
  - 3. Max distance determined by type of cartridge used
- G. Tactical Considerations
  - 1. Flammability with certain OC's
  - 2. Probe placement and point of aim
    - a. Away from sensitive areas (i.e. eyes, genitals, lips, nipples, head)
    - b. The back as a desired point of aim
    - c. Splitting the hemispheres
    - d. Drive stun
  - 3. Having lethal cover when using less lethal options

### III. LEGAL ISSUES

- A. Risk vs. benefit when using force
  - 1. Scott v. Harris
- B. Quantum of force
  - 1. Foreseeable injuries of a chosen force option
  - 2. Active resistance/Imminent Jeopardy
- C. Beaver v. City of Federal Way
  - 1. Each 5 second charge with an ECD is a separate UOF
- D. Considerations of the courts when determining justifiable force
  - 1. Type of force used
  - 2. Gravity of crime
  - 3. Safety threat to officers and the public
  - 4. The degree of resistance shown by the suspect
  - 5. Totality of the circumstance
- E. Less lethal weapons on agencies UOF continuum
  - 1. Moderate level of force
- F. Documentation of use
  - 1. Advisal to supervisor
  - 2. Documented in the following
    - a. UOF report
    - b. Criminal report
    - c. Booking application
    - d. W&I 5150 forms

## IV. PROFICIENCY TESTING

- A. On the range practical testing will be conducted and safety equipment will be used.
- B. Student requirements
  - 1. Safety while handling and utilizing weapons
  - 2. Demonstrate proficiency with weapons and particular features of the device
  - 3. Demonstrate proficiency loading and unloading the weapon
  - 4. Demonstrate proficiency drawing and holstering the weapon
  - 5. Accurately impact the target in designated points of aim
    - a. Not impacting sensitive areas of the body
  - 6. Demonstrate proficiency with the handling of malfunctions
