XV. Trauma Emergencies

- A. Soft tissue injuries and wounds;

XVI. Testing

These guidelines are based on the minimum skills to be demonstrated

- A. Primary Assessment
 - 1. Check for responsiveness
 - 2. Check pulse
 - 3. Check airway
 - 4. Check breathing
- B. Rescue Breathing (provide effective breaths)
 - 1. Adult
 - 2. Child
 - 3. Infant
- C. CPR/AED (One- and two-person, deliver high quality CPR, with AED)
 - 1. Adult
 - 2. Child
 - 3. Infant
- D. Clearing an Obstructed Airway
 - 1. Conscious and unconscious adult, child, and infant
 - 2. Obese or pregnant
- E. Bleeding Control. Demonstrate first aid techniques for controlling bleeding while using PPE:

- 1. Direct pressure
- 2. Pressure bandages
- 3. Tourniquet device, including noting time and location of application
- 4. Hemostatic dressings/wound packing
- 5. Chest seals and dressings
- F. Bandaging Injuries while using PPE. Demonstrate first aid techniques in accordance with the following

principles:

- 1. Use the cleanest material available
- 2. Expose the injury site
- 3. Cover the entire injury site
- 4. Bandage without impairing circulation
- 5. Leave fingers and toes exposed
- 6. Immobilize injury site as necessary
- 7. Remove gloves correctly
- 8. Wash hands and disinfect equipment after providing treatment
