



California POST Academy Training: San Bernardino County Sheriff-Coroner Credit Recommendation Guide

The (state) POST Academy training has been evaluated by the College of Criminal Justice and Security to potentially fulfill 30 required course of study credits in the BSCJA program unless specified otherwise in policy or limited by the state or jurisdiction of a student's residence. In order to receive any of the credits recommended below, students will need to submit a PLA application, proof of completion for their respective (state) POST Academy training, and a course waiver form. There are fees associated with your PLA submission. However, you may be eligible for PLA benefits. Please contact your Finance Advisor for more information.
