HAGMAN EXPANDS VETERANS PARK PASS AVAILABILITY

Ontario, CA – San Bernardino County Supervisor Curt Hagman’s proposal to expand free day use passes for veterans at county parks was unanimously approved by the Board of Supervisors today. Hagman’s idea was to include Congressional Medal of Honor holders among those entitled to free park access.

“The Congressional Medal of Honor is our nation’s highest military honor. It is bestowed upon servicemen who demonstrated heroism above and beyond the call of duty in defeating the enemy and saving lives of their fellow soldiers” noted Hagman.

“This is a small gesture of thanks to San Bernardino County residents who gave so much of themselves that all of us may live in freedom. Veterans deserve our gratitude and our support. I will continue to work to further expand access to county parks to more of our county’s veterans,” concluded Hagman.

Medal of Honor holders now join disabled veterans and former prisoners of war in eligibility for a free Veterans Pass to all San Bernardino County parks. For eligibility information or to apply for a Veterans Pass, contact Supervisor Hagman at Supervisor.Hagman@bos.sbcounty.gov.

Supervisor Hagman was elected to represent the Fourth District on the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors in November 2014. Prior to that, he served three terms in the California State Legislature. He owns several businesses and is a former Councilman and Mayor of Chino Hills.
