YUCCA VALLEY — The first ever Family Fun Fair at the Yucca Valley Airport took place Sunday. Event coordinator Angela Leggett wanted to give families one last summer event together. Leggett plans to hold the fair annually. "We'll make it even bigger and better next year," she said.

Temperatures rocketed above 100 degrees, but families were not deterred and showed up in large numbers.

Few family fairs have antique cars AND vintage planes.

Fewer still have fire trucks, ambulances, police cars, military vehicles AND pony rides.

Early in the event there were plane and drone demos.

Both local car clubs, the Morongo Basin Car Club — Roadrunners and Route 62, brought vehicles to the fair.

Kids also had face painting and a bounce house and many were carrying balloon animal souvenirs.

The **San Bernardino County fire** department brought out a fire engine and medic ambulance.

The Morongo Basin sheriff's station displayed two police vehicles and a Citizens Patrol SUV.

The Marine Corps provided three military units including an LAV25 amphibious vehicle.

Family Fun Fair fare included pizza, dogs, burgers, snow cones and lemonade.

Leggett's goal of a low-cost community event was achieved and promises to be successful Labor Day pastime in the future.

Fire Crew Battles Flames on San Bernardino's Little Mountain

Firefighters battled a vegetation fire on Little Mountain in San Bernardino, California, for hours on the evening of September 4.

Footage shared by the San Bernardino County Fire District showed large flames and smoke engulfing a residential area close to Little Mountain.

The fire department said it was "working on hot spots and reinforcing containment lines."

It added that crews would remain on scene overnight for mop-up and line construction.

The 15-acre blaze was referred to as a vegetation fire but it is unclear what sparked the fire.

Earlier this summer, local media reported that police were looking for an arson suspect after a 70-acre fire engulfed the Little Mountain area.
