The Fontana Police Department reported that a female bus driver was assaulted at the Metrolink Station on Oct. 4.

A female bus driver was assaulted at the Metrolink Station in Fontana on Oct. 4, according to the Fontana Police Department.

At 11:20 a.m., Fontana Police Dispatch received a 911 call from the Metrolink Station at 16777 Orange Way regarding a bus driver who was punched in the face by a passenger.

Officers arrived and detained 63-year-old Larry Young, a resident of San Bernardino. He was arrested and charged with assault.

Witnesses told officers the attack was unprovoked, said Officer Daniel Romero.

The driver had swelling to her nose and right eye. She was treated on scene by **San Bernardino County Fire** Department medics.

SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY, Calif. (KABC) -- The driver of a tour bus sustained cuts to his face after a boulder fell from a freeway overpass in San Bernardino County, crashing through the windshield window.

The bus was traveling down the eastbound 10 Freeway Monday morning, off the Sierra overpass, but it's still unclear how the boulder fell.

One passenger that was on the bus heading to Arizona took pictures of the damage. That person said the driver did an excellent job controlling the bus and bringing it to a safe stop.

The **San Bernardino County Fire** Department responded shortly after.

The driver was treated at the scene for cuts to his face and forehead, but refused to be transported to the hospital.

COUNTY TO UPGRADE JOSHUA TREE HAZARDOUS WASTE FACILITY

Household hazardous waste here in Morongo Basin will be on the agenda when county supervisors meet at 10 a.m. in San Bernardino tomorrow. Reporter Mike Lipsitz is here to get to the bottom of it...

There is just one item of consequence exclusively to our Morongo Basin on tomorrow's long agenda. It is retroactive acceptance of a \$239,000 grant awarded by the CalRecycle to upgrade the Joshua Tree Household Hazardous Waste collection facility. The grant will fund an asphalt overlay at the collection facility as well as construction of a pre-fabricated steel canopy to provide a covered work area. Operated by the **County Fire** Department, the facility is on the south side of the highway just east of downtown Joshua Tree. It is open on the third Saturday of every month from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. for Morongo Basin residents to drop off motor oil, poisons, fertilizers, old medicines, pool chemicals, and other hazardous waste for free proper disposal. These items cannot be thrown in regular trash and should never be poured on the ground or down drains.

Tomorrow's meeting streams online and to the first-floor teleconferencing room in the County Government Center on White Feather Road in Joshua Tree where public comment may be made via live video link.

In other County news, when the 2020 Census is done, Fontana is poised to emerge as the new most populous city in San Bernardino County, replacing the city of San Bernardino, which has long held that distinction and prestige as the county seat.
