TWO SUSPICIOUS FIRES IN WONDER VALLEY SUNDAY MORNING

Firefighters responded to two suspicious fires in Wonder Valley early Sunday morning. **County Fire** Battalion Chief Scott Tuttle said the first call was at 1:30 a.m. at Valle Vista Road and Falderman Avenue, where firefighters found a manufactured home fully involved in flames. Tuttle said the home appeared to be abandoned. County firefighters, with the assistance of the Combat Center, had the fire knocked down in about five minutes and contained the blaze to the vacant building, which was a total loss.

Tuttle said as firefighters were clearing that fire, a second call came in at 3 a.m. at Blower Road and Pioneer Road in Wonder Valley. Firefighters arrived to find several travel trailers fully involved and threatening other travel trailers, vehicles, and out buildings. County firefighters, with the assistance of a water tender and an engine from the Combat Center, had the fire under control in about 30 minutes, and kept the fire from spreading. The trailers were a total loss. Both fires are considered suspicious, and are under investigation.

A fire damaged a Bloomington home in the early morning hours of Nov. 17, according to the **San Bernardino County Fire** Department.

At 3:35 a.m., fire crews were dispatched to a reported structure fire in the 18300 block of Mindanao Avenue. Crews arrived on scene in six minutes to find the single-story home with smoke and fire showing from the garage and front of the home.

Crews also encountered two vehicles on fire and an immediate exposure to a nearby house.

The fire was knocked down in 30 minutes. Damage estimates were not immediately available, but the home did receive heavy smoke and fire damage.

The American Red Cross assisted one displaced occupant with temporary housing.

Rollover crash on Victorville's Village Drive injures two

VICTORVILLE — A rollover crash sent two people to the hospital Saturday evening, with the car landing in front of a neighboring apartment building.

The crash happened at about 4:23 p.m. in the 16300 block of Village Drive, said Victorville Fire Department Battalion Chief Dave Hernandez.

Firefighters had to extricate one of the occupants of the car which ended upright in front of the apartments, Hernandez said.

A man was airlifted to Loma Linda University Medical Center, while a woman was taken by ambulance to Arrowhead Regional Medical Center. Both appeared to be suffering from moderate injuries, Hernandez said.

The car was likely traveling northbound on Village Drive at a high speed when it lost control, Hernandez said, judging by the pattern of debris. Tow truck drivers could be seen picking a bumper, battery and other items out of a field next to the apartment building's bent fence.

Several residents at the scene told the Daily Press there needs to be more safety measures installed on the northern stretch of Village Drive to Air Expressway.

Mack Fields lives across the street from the apartment building. He said a car also lost control and ended up in his yard before.

Fields called the intersection of Clovis Street and Village Drive near his residence a "dead man's curve" for the number of collisions.

"They need to put a light up there," he said.

A woman driving on Clovis Street expressed the same concern, asking who she could talk to about constructing a light because "there's just too many accidents."

A search of Daily Press archives showed at least five collisions on Village Drive dating back to January 2018, with three people killed and 10 injured.

Fire in Mentone home chases residents

Residents of a home in Mentone were displaced Friday night, Nov. 15, by a fire that appeared to destroy the residence.

Firefighters responding about 8 p.m. to the 1700 block of Mentone Boulevard arrived to find heavy fire coming from the front of the building and several cars on fire, a **San Bernardino County Fire** Department Twitter message said.

Crews that included the Redlands Fire Department pronounced the fire as knocked down about 8:40 p.m. The cause of the fire was under investigation.

The American Red Cross was called to assist the residents.

HESPERIA, Calif, (VVNG.com) — A pedestrian was struck and killed on the I-15 freeway Saturday night.

It happened on the southbound I-15, south of Oak Hill Road at 8:13 pm on November 16, 2019.

According to the California Highway Patrol incident logs, a reporting party witnessed a male climb over the barrier and run into lanes. Per the logs, the pedestrian was struck by multiple vehicles.

San Bernardino County Fire arrived on scene and pronounced one person dead at the scene.

CHP has started a traffic break south of Ranchero Road. The no. 1 & 2 lanes are currently blocked as officials investigate.

Pedestrian Fatally Struck by Multiple Vehicles on 5 Freeway near Oak Hill Road in Hesperia

Hesperia, California (November 16, 2019) – A pedestrian was hit and killed by a car in Hesperia on Saturday night.

According to a local news source, the accident happened on Interstate 5 Freeway near Oak Hill Road at about 8:13 p.m.

The California Highway Patrol said a pedestrian jumped over a barrier and ran into the traffic lanes and was hit by multiple vehicles.

Officials of **San Bernardino County Fire** who arrived at the scene pronounced the pedestrian dead.

The identity of the pedestrian was not immediately disclosed.

No further information was provided.

An investigation into the accident is ongoing.
