Firefighters battle a 2nd brush fire within 24 hours in the Cajon Pass Tuesday

CAJON PASS, Calif. (VVNG.com) — Firefighters responded to a brush fire in the Cajon Pass for the second time in less than 24 hours on Tuesday.

At about 1:53 pm on October 1, 2019, dispatch received reports of two brush fires on the northbound I-15 freeway, north of Kenwood.

According to scanner traffic, the upper fire is holding at a quarter acre and the forward rate of spread has been stopped. The 2nd fire is also about a quarter acre and the forward rate of spread has also been stopped.

Motorists traveling through the area should expect delays as the no. 5 lane is expected to remain closed for an unknown amount of time.

The San Bernardino National Forest is taking the lead and is being assisted by **San Bernardino County Fire** and CalFire.

This is the second brush fire to erupt in the cajon pass within 24 hours. On Monday at about 4:10 pm, fire crews responded to a 10-acre brush fire dubbed the #DevoreFire along the NB-15 near Kenwood. The fire kept crews busy into the night.

The official cause of both fires are under investigation at this time.

The driver of a black Chevy Camaro was seriously injured in a two-car collision in the northwestern area of Fontana on Oct. 1.

At about 10:50 p.m., the Fontana Police Department and the **San Bernardino County Fire Department** responded to the incident in the 14100 block of Foothill Boulevard.

When firefighters arrived on scene, they located a car that was on fire in the westbound lanes of Foothill.

Firefighters were able to remove the driver from the car and quickly extinguished the fire.

Emergency medical responders treated the driver and he was transported to a hospital with serious injuries.

According to a Fontana P.D. officer, witnesses said the driver of the Camaro was traveling eastbound on Foothill at a high rate of speed and allegedly blew through the red light at Banana Avenue and Foothill.

Authorities said the driver of a white Hyundai Sonata was driving northbound on Banana and entered the intersection on a green light and broadsided the Camaro.

The driver of the Camaro continued eastbound on Foothill, jumped the center divider, and came to a fiery stop in the westbound lanes of Foothill.

Both vehicles sustained major damage.

Foothill was closed in both directions from Banana to Cherry for the investigation and cleanup of fuel.

The Fontana P.D. is handling the investigation.
