Head-on collision takes place in northern Fontana on Jan. 28

A man was hospitalized after two cars were involved in a head-on collision in the northern part of Fontana on Jan. 28.

The Fontana Police Department and the **San Bernardino County Fire** Department responded to the accident, which occurred at about 4:47 p.m. at South Highland Avenue and Cypress Avenue.

A gray Honda Civic and a silver Honda Accord were traveling in opposite directions and collided on South Highland, according to a police officer.

Witnesses to the crash said that the Civic was traveling westbound on Highland and allegedly crossed into the eastbound lanes before hitting the Accord. Witnesses said the Civic spun around and stopped, facing east in the eastbound lanes.

Paramedics treated the driver of the Accord and transported him to a local hospital with unknown type of injuries.

The Fire Department cleaned up a small oil spill, and both cars were towed. The Fontana P.D. is investigating the accident.

1 killed, 3 injured in Cajon Boulevard crash

CAJON PASS — Authorities are investigating a head-on crash on Cajon Boulevard that resulted in a person's death Friday afternoon.

Reported at 3:47 p.m., the crash occurred on Cajon Boulevard about a mile south of the Cleghorn Road off-ramp to southbound Interstate 15. Details are scarce, but California Highway Patrol and **San Bernardino County Fire** Department officials confirmed one person died in the incident.

County Fire spokesman Eric Sherwin said it was a head-on crash involving a sedan and a full-size SUV, described as a black Chevy Tahoe and white Nissan Altima. Further specifics on how the crash occurred are unavailable, but the sedan caught fire after the collision, Sherwin said.

“The fire was kept in check by bystanders before fire personnel arrived,” Sherwin said. “The sedan was occupied by a sole occupant, the driver, who was pronounced deceased on scene.”

The identity of the person is being withheld pending positive identification and notification of next of kin. Sherwin said the SUV was occupied by two adults and an infant. The adults sustained moderate to major injuries and were classified as “immediate patients”, Sherwin said, but the baby was classified as a “delayed patient.” All three were taken to Loma Linda University Hospital Center for treatment.

A third ambulance was requested for an elderly woman who suffered an unknown medical emergency not related to the crash, Sherwin said.

“It appears as though it occurred while she was in the traffic backup,” Sherwin said. “She was taken to St. Bernardine's Hospital for treatment.”

The northbound lanes of Cajon Boulevard were completely shut down between Cleghorn and Swarthout Canyon roads, according to CHP logs, and the Cleghorn Road off-ramp onto southbound I-15 is also closed. The duration of the closures was unknown.

The crash remains under investigation by the San Bernardino CHP office.

Fire destroys Mohave Valley mobile home

MOHAVE VALLEY — A fire destroyed a mobile home Friday afternoon.

No one was injured in the blaze, said Fire Marshal Don Gibson, Mohave Valley Fire Department. A resident was in the home when the fire started and was able to get out before fire crews arrived.

Emergency crews from Fort Mohave Fire Department, **San Bernardino County Fire** Department and Fort Mohave Fire Department responded about 1:20 p.m. to reports of a mobile home fire in the 10500 block of South Fremont Road.

The cause of the blaze has been ruled accidental, Gibson said.

The fire destroyed about 45 percent of the home, damaging the back half of the mobile and breaking through the roof, Gibson said. Fire crews were able to keep the blaze from spreading to the front end of the trailer.

“The crews did a great job, especially given how far they had to travel to get to the fire,” Gibson said. “There is significant smoke damage, but the contents in the front end of the home were saved. Due to the age of the mobile home and the damage done, it will not be able to be rehabilitated and it will be determined a total loss.”

It was reported the initial calls to 911 Dispatch came from a retired firefighter in the area and from Tribal Police. Arriving crews reported visible smoke from the residence and requested an additional two engine companies. About 1:30 p.m. dispatch requested an “all call” for additional manpower.

Crews were able to bring the fire under control by 1:48 p.m.

Fort Mojave Tribal Police, Baker Ambulance and Mohave Valley Ambulance provided support, Gibson said. Water and electric utilities also responded.
