CAJON PASS, Calif. (VVNG.com) — Several people were injured in a fiery head-on collision in the cajon pass Saturday evening.

The crash was reported at 4:55 pm on old Cajon Blvd and Applewhite Road on December 21, 2019.

San Bernardino County Fire responded to the scene and located two vehicles fully engulfed with a small patch of vegetation on fire.

All occupants managed to exit from the vehicles.

Fire crews were able to get a quick handle on the fire and determined they had a total of four patients with one of them critically injured, scanner traffic reported.

CHP is handling the investigation into the crash.

For 22 years, Santa has been working extra hard to make sure that thousands of Fontana's underprivileged children receive Christmas gifts.

The annual Fontana Santas program, coordinated by the Fontana Unified School District and the Fontana School Police Department, delivered toys to multitudes of happy kids on Dec. 21.

The toy drive was first started more than two decades ago by Lydia Wibert and the late Cindy Evaro.

"It is amazing to be a part of this great program that continues to grow and engage so many members of our community," Wibert said.

During the past month, gifts were donated by FUSD families, teachers and staff, Fontana School Police, the Fontana Foundation of Hope, local service clubs and businesses.

"My grandchildren are now participating in this program, just like my children did," Wibert said, "so it's spanning generations."

On the morning of the distribution, volunteers gathered at Kaiser High School and then proceeded to take toys to families at mobile home parks in the city, where children had a chance to talk to Santa and Mrs. Claus along with personnel from the School Police Department and **San Bernardino County Fire** Department.

In addition, dozens of FUSD high school students remained at Kaiser and donated their time to organize fun activities for community members, who also received a free pancake breakfast provided by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints (Fontana Stake).
