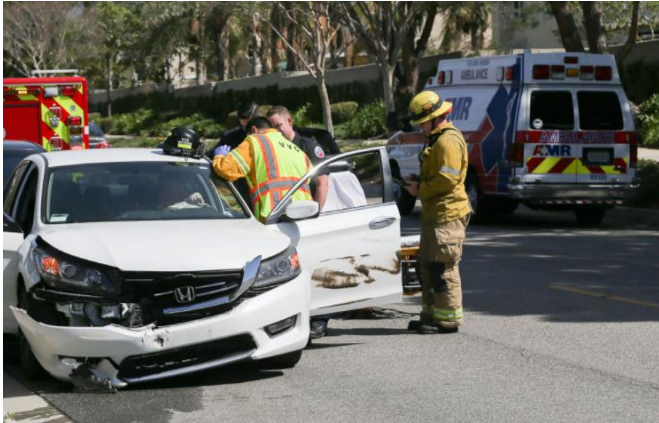

Police investigate possible hit-and-run collision on April 10 in Fontana

Police are investigating a possible hit-and-run collision in which a female motorist was injured on April 10 in Fontana.

At about 10:30 a.m., the Fontana Police Department and the **San Bernardino County Fire** Department responded to the 7100 block of Hemlock Avenue in the northwestern part of the city. Officers found a white Honda Accord parked along the curb.

The driver complained of pain from the accident and was transported to a hospital with unknown injuries. The Accord had front end damage as well as damage to the driver's side door.

Police did not find another vehicle and are investigating the accident as a possible hit-and-run, according to an officer at the scene.

VICTORVILLE — A 24-year-old man was rushed to a trauma center after he was stabbed at a home here Tuesday afternoon.

Further details are forthcoming, but San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department officials were requested to respond to the incident, which occurred in the 12300 block of Bridgewood Lane around 1:15 p.m. Tuesday.

Victorville Sheriff's Station spokeswoman Mara Rodriguez said the man was stabbed in the chest, but further details on his condition and what led to the incident are not yet available.

"Deputies and detectives are still on scene conducting the investigation," Rodriguez said.

The victim was flown to an area trauma center for treatment, according to **San Bernardino County Fire** Department spokesman Eric Sherwin. No other injuries have been reported.

Authorities remained on scene as of 2:30 p.m. combing the area for evidence.
