## Fire and Mutual Aid Update

San Bernardino County Fire crews continue to fight fires in San Bernardino County, Los Angeles County and throughout the State. More than 100 San Bernardino County Firefighters are currently deployed to fires.

### Bobcat Fire

Started September 5, 2020 in the Angeles National Forest in Los Angeles County. Fire has burned more than 100,000 acres. Fire continues to burn west of San Bernardino County. San Bernardino County Fire continues to monitor the fire's progress and has plans in place if the fire threatens San Bernardino County communities.
