

Watch firefighters save 2 dogs, cat from Victorville apartment fire

Multiple reports of a fire at a Victorville apartment complex turned into a rescue operation Wednesday, Oct. 11. As first responders started to attack the fire at the Rodeo Meadow Apartments and search the dwelling, it was discovered that no human occupants were home at the time. But, there were two dogs and a cat still located inside, according to **San Bernardino County fire** officials.

A helmet camera from one of the firefighters caught the action and rescue and was uploaded to YouTube Monday night.

In all, 25 personnel were on scene including two trucks, five engines, two chief officers and two fire investigators.

At this time the cause of the fire is still under investigation.

A woman was hospitalized after she was involved in a two-vehicle traffic accident in northern Fontana on Oct. 15.

The incident took place at about 1:45 p.m. on the corner of Almeria and Baseline avenues.

A silver Mazda which had been traveling westbound on Baseline swerved and crashed into a gray Honda which was waiting for the southbound signal on Almeria.

The Fontana Police Department and **San Bernardino County Fire Department** responded to the accident, and fire personnel transported the driver of the Honda to a hospital with unknown injuries.

The Fontana P.D. was investigating the collision

Mariposa road closed after car crashes into power pole in Victorville

VICTORVILLE, Calif. (VVNG.com) A stretch of Mariposa Road was shut down following a single-vehicle rollover crash here Monday evening in Victorville.

The traffic accident was reported at 7:18 p.m. near the intersection of Tamarisk Avenue and Mariposa Road. Passerby's witnessed the crash and immediately ran to the aid of a young man inside the vehicle and called 911.

"The car was traveling northbound on the 15 freeway and veered off the freeway and crashed into the pole causing the transformer to explode," stated Geraldine Del Villar who witnessed the crash.

When **San Bernardino County Fire** and AMR arrived they located the single vehicle on its roof with damage to a power pole.

My husband Marcos parked the car and ran over to him. "I wanted to make sure he was ok and there was nobody else in the car," stated Marcos.

The driver of the vehicle was able to exit the car safely without injury and declined medical treatment at the scene.

"It was scary everything went dark and all of a sudden there was a large explosion. He had someone watching over him for sure because he walked away without a scratch."

Fire personnel requested a hard road closure on Mariposa Road between Yates and the northbound I-15 Palmdale Road off-ramp for an unknown duration while emergency crews make repairs.

The accident caused a temporary power outage that was restored within 30 seconds. The cause of the crash is currently under investigation.
