Motor home fire lightly scorches house

MOUNTAIN VIEW ACRES — A fire that engulfed and destroyed a motor home was quickly doused by firefighters before it spread to a home Tuesday afternoon.

San Bernardino County Fire Department received a report of a motor home on fire about 2:44 p.m.

Fire personnel upgraded it to a structure fire response after learning it was parked in front of a single-story residence in the 14600 block of Cerezo Road.

County Fire Captain Jeremy Kern said the thick column of black smoke could be seen "from several miles out."

The house is located in an unincorporated area covered by County Fire but bordered by Victorville city limits.

A crew in a Victorville Fire Department engine happened to be in the area when the fire broke out.

They were the first ones to arrive and quickly began to extinguish it.

Kern said the fire damaged the nearby house, a portable storage container which had personal belongings in it and a U-haul truck.

A car parked in a neighboring property was also damaged by flames.

A County fire engine, ladder truck and battalion chief were also working on scene.

The cause of the fire is still being investigated.

Police search for driver in fatal hit-and-run in San Bernardino

A 37-year-old man was struck and killed while crossing a San Bernardino street late Monday night, May 20, and police are searching for the driver, San Bernardino police said Tuesday.

The unidentified San Bernardino man was found in the 500 block of East Central Avenue around 10:45 p.m. Monday, according to a police statement.

San Bernardino County fire paramedics took the injured man to a hospital where he was pronounced dead, officials said.

Using evidence collected at the scene, San Bernardino police traffic investigators determined the man was likely walking east in the 500 block of East Central Avenue, along the south side of the road, when he was struck, officials said. The driver did not stop.
