CAJON PASS, Calif. (VVNG.com) — A pick-up truck towing a large trailer jack-knifed on the southbound I-15 freeway in the Cajon Pass Saturday morning.

It happened at 9:22 am, just before the 15/215 split and involved a GMC Uhaul truck pulling a Transport trailer is blocking the no. 2 & 3 lanes of the SB I-15 freeway.

San Bernardino County Firefighters arrived on scene and confirmed no injuries were reported.

Motorist traveling down the hill are reporting traffic as you approach the incident and smooth sailing once you pass it.

# Small plane crashes at Hesperia Airport Saturday

HESPERIA, Calif. (VVNG.com) — No injuries were reported after a small plane crashed into a building at the Hesperia Airport Saturday morning.

At about 10:00 am, **San Bernardino County Firefighters** were requested to respond to the airport at 7070 Summit Valley Road reference a plane crash.

Upon arrival, firefighters located a red/orange Cessna plane that had crashed into a green storage type building along the runway.

According to firefighters, no injuries were reported and everyone exited the plane.

Sheriff's spokeswoman Cindy Bachman said a small, single-seat fixed-wing airplane was landing when it collided with an uninhabited steel building at Hesperia Airport. "The pilot sustained a minor injury to his leg but is otherwise fine," stated Bachman.

A San Bernardino County Sheriff's Aviation Helicopter landed at the scene to assist with the investigation and determine the cause of the crash.

## Pilot suffers minor injury when plane crashes into building at Hesperia Airport

The pilot of a small airplane suffered a minor leg injury Saturday morning, Dec. 8, when his aircraft crashed into a building at Hesperia Airport, authorities said.

The crash happened at 10 a.m. when the red airplane landed, veered off the runway and struck an aqua-green metal hangar. One side of the building was pushed in by the nose of the plane. The pilot was the only person on board, said Federal Aviation Administration spokesman Ian Gregor.

The plane is a single-engine, experimental CH 750 Cruzer, Gregor said. It's the type of plane that comes in a kit and is assembled by the customer.

No one was in the building, said Cindy Bachman, a spokeswoman for the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department.

The FAA and National Transportation Safety Board were investigating the accident, said Eric Sherwin, spokesman for the **San Bernardino County Fire** Department.
