Fire causes about \$200,000 in damages to three businesses at strip mall in Fontana on May 16

Three businesses were damaged in an early-morning fire at a strip mall in Fontana on May 16, according to the **San Bernardino County Fire Department.**

The second-alarm fire started on the roof of the building at about 2 a.m. and spread into the attic of the business at 9721 Sierra Avenue, the Fire Department said.

The blaze was extinguished about 90 minutes later.

No persons were injured, but the fire caused about \$200,000 in damages. The Fire Department is investigating the cause of the incident.

Victorville hotel evacuated due to smoke

VICTORVILLE, Calif. (VVNG.com) The Extended Stay Studio Hotel on Monarch Boulevard was temporarily evacuated Wednesday afternoon after reports of smoke.

Just after 5:30 p.m. the San Bernardino County Fire Department responded to 14786 Monarch Blvd after receiving reports that there was smoke visible on the third floor of the hotel.

Once firefighters entered the building they determined the smoke was caused by a stove top cooking fire that did not spread and was quickly contained, **San Bernardino County Fire Department** Spokesman Eric Sherwin confirmed.

Firefighters used fans to expel the smoke from the unit and those staying at the hotel were able to go back into their rooms, a hotel representative stated.

A total of 4 engines, 2 trucks, squad, and a Battalion Chief responded to the incident.
