ONE DEAD, THREE INJURED, IN HEAD-ON CRASH NEAR AMBOY TUESDAY AFTERNOON

One person is dead and three others injured in a head-on crash on Amboy Road Tuesday afternoon. About 3:15 p.m. a white subcompact car and a mid-sized sedan collided on Amboy Road about nine miles south of Amboy. **County Fire** Battalion Chief Scott Tuttle said the female driver—and sole occupant of the subcompact car— was trapped inside her vehicle and the fire department had to use the Jaws of Life to get to her. However, she was pronounced deceased at the scene. Helicopters from the Sheriff's Department and the California Highway Patrol flew two children and the female driver of the other car to Desert Hospital in Palm Springs. One child suffered serious injuries; Tuttle said the woman and the second child had moderate injuries. The California Highway Patrol is investigating.

MOTORHOME FIRE CLOSES HIGHWAY 62 EARLY THIS MORNING

A motorhome is a total loss following a fire that closed eastbound lanes of Highway 62 in Yucca Valley just after midnight this morning. **County Fire** Battalion Chief Scott Tuttle said the motorhome was fully involved with flames when firefighters from Yucca Valley, Morongo Valley, and CalFire arrived at the top of the eastbound Yucca Grade on Highway 62. Tuttle said the fire was knocked down in eight minutes, but they were there about an hour mopping up afterward. Both eastbound lanes of the highway were closed during the blaze. Tuttle said the cause appears to be mechanical failure.

Burn victim airlifted following garage fire in Hesperia

HESPERIA — One person suffered burn injuries in a garage fire here Sunday morning.

San Bernardino County Fire Department personnel responded to reports of a structure fire in a detached garage near a home in the 13000 block of Wells Fargo Street at approximately 11:50 a.m.

“First arriving battalion chief found a well-involved detached structure with exposures to multiple vehicles on the property,” County Fire officials said. “One burn victim was also found upon initial arrival.”

Firefighters quickly went into attack mode to limit the spread of the blaze to any additional buildings or vehicles, with the initial priorities to contain the fire to the detached garage.

Crews were eventually able to knock down the fire in 41 minutes and a primary and secondary search found the building to be all clear.

The burn victim was airlifted to a burn center for their injuries and fire investigators were requested to determine the cause of the blaze.

A total of one truck company, five engines, one ambulance and one helicopter with a total of 24 personnel responded to the fire.
