Pursued vehicle in 100-mph chase crashes in Yucaipa, injuring 2

A pursuit by Riverside County sheriff's deputies of a suspected intoxicated motorist, which reached speeds of about 100 mph, ended with a single-vehicle rollover crash on the westbound 10 Freeway in Yucaipa that injured two occupants, the **San Bernardino County Fire** Department said Monday.

The chase started in Calimesa about Sunday midnight when a deputy attempted a traffic stop for a suspected driving under the influence on Singleton Road, but the driver instead drove onto the freeway and the short pursuit took place, the Sheriff's Department said in a statement.

The pursued car crashed into the center median on the freeway, just past County Line Road. One person had major injuries and the other suffered minor injuries.

Both people were taken to Loma Linda University Medical Center.

The sheriff's statement said authorities planned to arrest the injured driver, Fabian Ramirez, 27, of San Bernardino on suspicion of DUI and other charges.

Resident displaced after Lucerne Valley home fire Tuesday

LUCERNE VALLEY — Firefighters doused a blaze that erupted at a motor home here Tuesday morning.

It took **San Bernardino County Fire** Department firefighters almost an hour to combat the flames, which erupted at a double-wide motor home in the 31000 block of Highway 18, near Buena Vista Road, at 11:33 a.m. Tuesday.

County Fire spokesman Eric Sherwin said firefighters faced "heavy smoke" from the home's front left side when they first arrived.

"The fire started in a single room," Sherwin said. "Firefighters went into attack mode to put out the flames. It took us about 45 minutes to bring it under control."

County Fire was assisted by personnel with the Apple Valley Fire Protection District and a CalFire San Bernardino unit. Sherwin could not provide details on damages, but said county personnel was requested to "board up" the home.

Sherwin said one person reported a minor injury and was taken to St. Joseph Health, St. Mary for treatment. No other injuries were reported.

Red Cross was requested to assist one displaced resident, Sherwin said. The cause of the fire remains under investigation.

Truck fire causes traffic delays on Main Street in Hesperia

HESPERIA, Calif. (VVNG.com) — Firefighters responded to a truck fire at a busy intersection in Hesperia Tuesday morning.

It happened at about 8:35 am, when the engine compartment of a flat-bed truck erupted into flames as the truck was at a stop at in the eastbound lanes of Main Street at Mariposa Road.

Firefighters with **San Bernardino County Fire** arrived on scene and knocked down the fire within several minutes.

Firefighters were able to keep the fire from spreading to the flat-bed cargo area, which was fully loaded with various sized boxes.

Traffic on Main Street is reportedly gridlocked in the area surrounding the fire. No injuries were reported as a result of the fire.

The cause of the fire remains under investigation.
