Police and fire personnel honored Navaeh Telles, a 9-year-old Fontana girl, for calmly calling 911 and helping to save her mother's life.

A 9-year-old Fontana girl was honored recently for her heroic lifesaving efforts.

Navaeh Telles was recognized by the Fontana Police Department, **San Bernardino County Fire** Department, and a television station for how effectively she called 911 during a life-threatening emergency.

During the incident, Navaeh was alone with her mother, who suddenly suffered a medical emergency, leaving her unresponsive. Navaeh called 911 and was very calm and composed, telling dispatch her home address and all pertinent information in order to get her mom help. As a result, the mother was treated and is now healthy and safe, the P.D. said.

"We commend Navaeh for jumping into action and knowing her personal information that is important when calling for help," the Fontana P.D. said in a Facebook post. "Without Navaeh taking action, her mom would not have received the help she needed as fast as she did."

When NBC-TV heard about Navaeh, the station featured her in a special story.

Navaeh was invited to the P.D. station to meet the police chief, the fire chief, and the dispatchers she spoke with that scary afternoon.

"Everyone in the public safety sector within Fontana wanted to meet this awesome young lady and commend her for the job well done," the P.D. said. "Navaeh was greeted with gifts, awards and a tour of the station."

A pile of tires on fire in Wonder Valley sent up black smoke that could be seen for miles Wednesday morning.

Twentynine Palms and Wonder Valley firefighters were called to the fire near Amboy Road and Wilson Road in Wonder Valley about 9:10 Wednesday morning.

Firefighters had the fire under control in 20 minutes.

County Fire Captain Zach Taylor said tires had been dumped on the homeowner's property and the resident was burning trash and the flames had jumped over to the nearby tires.

Taylor reminds residents that burn permits can be obtained at local fire stations, and firefighters will explain the burn permit restrictions.

HESPERIA, Calif. (VVNG.com) — A pedestrian hit by a vehicle on Wednesday afternoon was airlifted to a trauma center.

It happened on Santa Fe Avenue near Olive Street at about 1:22 pm.

San Bernardino County Firefighters at the scene located a pedestrian with multiple injuries and requested an airship.

Sheriff's deputies shut down the roadway to allow County helicopter H325 to land at the accident scene.

The pedestrian was airlifted to Arrowhead Regional Medical Center.

Southbound Highway 395 briefly closed after crash in Victorville

VICTORVILLE, Calif. (VVNG.com) – Southbound lanes of US Highway 395 were briefly closed following a crash Wednesday morning.

The crash happened at 10:12 a.m. on Highway 395 just south of Mesa Street and involved a single Honda sedan that crash into a utility pole on the eastbound side of the highway.

A helicopter was requested to land at Sunset Ridge Park on Eucalyptus Street to transport the 25-year-old female victim to Loma Linda University Medical Center.

The female driver is reported to have multiple fractures to her leg, scanner traffic reported.
