SPRINKLERS SAVE A HOUSE FROM BURNING

A residential sprinkler system did its job yesterday and saved a Yucca Valley house from being destroyed or damaged in a fire.

County Fire Battalion Chief Donnie Viloria said firefighters were called to the 58000 block of San Andreas Road at 5:15 p.m. Tuesday for a structure fire.

When firefighters arrived, they discovered it was a car on fire inside the garage; he said the residential sprinklers had turned on and kept the fire in check and saved the house.

Firefighters put the car in neutral and pushed it out of the garage while it was still burning to put out the flames.

Viloria said that due to the sprinklers, there was no smoke or structural damage to the house or garage, although items inside the garage were destroyed from the flames.

Hesperia Motorcycle Collision Takes Life of Victorville Man

VICTORVILLE, CA. – A 20-year-old Victorville man was struck and killed by a black sedan while riding his motorcycle late Monday morning.

At around 11:37 a.m., deputies from the Hesperia station responded to Main Street and I Avenue for the report of a vehicle versus motorcycle collision. When they arrived they found the motorcycle and a Scion TC and Randy Baker Jr., 20, of Victorville, lying on the roadway.

Authorities said that the Scion TC which was driven by a woman, was traveling west, and made a left turn into a gas station, striking Baker. The driver remained at the scene to cooperate with the investigation.

San Bernardino County Fire Department firefighters responded to the scene. Initially the plan was to airlift Baker until his condition declined causing them to transport him to Desert Valley Hospital where he was pronounced deceased at 12:15 p.m., according to the coroner's report.

A memorial account has been created through Go Fund Me to assist his remaining family that will now be faced with burying their loved one. According to the Go Fund Me Account, the family has suffered several losses together. Six children, including Randy, were left motherless, when their mother suddenly died in 2004, their father, Randy Sr. went on to raise his family. In 2006, Randy Sr. lost his life after being involved in a motorcycle accident.

The Go Fund Me account explains how the children were then separated, but later fought to be reunited. The six children reunited and rebonded. Since then, the oldest brother, Matt died as a result of a heart defect in February 2018, and now they have lost Randy Jr. The family needs time to grieve this unexpected loss and in order for them to do so, donations are being requested on their behalf to assist them with the costs associated with Randy Baker Jr.'s death.
