## Twin Peaks Home Damaged by Fire

Date/Time: December 28, 2020, 6:32 a.m.

Location: 25900 block, Highway 189, Twin Peaks

**Incident:** Residential Structure Fire

**Summary:** This morning at 6:32 San Bernardino County Fire crews were dispatched to a residential structure fire in the 25900 block of State Highway 189. 911 callers stated smoke and flames from a home.

Crews arrived in snowy conditions to find a two-story home well involved in fire. Due to the level of involvement a defensive attack was mounted. Crews concentrated their efforts on nearby exposure protection. While crews worked on fire attack, they found power lines had dropped & cordoned off the area.

Despite power lines down, steep terrain and snowfall the fire was knocked down in approximately 25 minutes. No injuries were reported, the house sustained heavy damage. The fire is under investigation by San Bernardino County Fire Department Investigators. No injuries to civilians or firefighters were reported.

San Bernardino County Fire responded with 4 Engines, a Medic Ambulance, Battalion Chief and a Fire Investigator. CALFIRE assisted with 2 engines.

San Bernardino County Fire Department engines in our mountain regions are all four-wheel drive and carry chains for adverse conditions. The engines carry 500 gallons of water, 1500 GPM pump and a full complement of tools to support our all-risk mission. Crews monitor weather conditions to ensure to "chain up" prior to an emergency response if conditions warrant.
