San Bernardino airport emergency drill to draw 300 participants

An emergency training exercise designed to test airport and community emergency responders in the event of an airport incident will draw about 300 participants to San Bernardino International Airport beginning at 10 a.m. Wednesday, Feb. 28, according to an airport news release.

The exercise includes a simulated emergency aircraft incident, training required by the Federal Aviation Administration every three years.

The airport is in the 1600 block of East Third Street, east of Del Rosa Drive.

The exercise will last a few hours but have no effect on airport operations. Sirens may be heard and emergency vehicles seen providing a mutual aid response.

More than 20 emergency agencies besides the airport staff will participate including the **San Bernardino County Fire** Department, the Cal Fire San Bernardino Unit and the San Manuel Fire Department, law enforcement, hospitals and emergency managers. The exercise will double as the annual training for East Valley agencies.

EMT and paramedic students from Crafton Hills and Victor Valley colleges will serve as simulated injured victims.
