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




Worst U.S. Metropolitan Area Unemployment Rates














Logistics Flow of Goods







U.S. v. California Manufacturing Jobs











Share of Underwater Homes Plunging






Exhibit 20.-Home Prices, So. California Markets Median Priced New & Existing Home, 3rd Quarter 2013








Home Price Trends

Exhibit 3.-Total Population Growth & Domestic In-Migration Inland Empire, Annual Change, 2001-2012






Economic Strategy For Socio-Economic Improvement
