Canvassing program in mountain communities begins July 22



San Bernardino County Animal Care and Control (ACC) will begin a door-to-door canvass in the communities of Blue Jay, Crestline, Cedar Glen, Cedar Pines Park, Green Valley Lake, Lake Arrowhead, Rim Forest, Twin Peaks and Valley of Enchantment. Canvassing will start July 22.



The goal of the canvassing program is to educate the public on responsible pet ownership and ensure all dogs over the age of four months have a current license and rabies vaccine. A license also helps identify the owner of a lost dog so they can be quickly reunited. All pit bull and pit bull-type dogs are required to be spayed or neutered.



Pet owners can prepare by having current dog licenses, vaccination records and spay/neuter certificates available to avoid possible citations. Owners of unlicensed dogs may obtain a license before canvassing begins at the following locations or online.

Licensing may also be purchased or renewed online at www.sbcounty.gov/acc.

A dog license costs \$36 for an altered dog and \$18 for disabled or senior residents (65 years and older). An unaltered dog license costs \$120. A \$20 late fee will apply if an owner has been notified and the license application or renewal is 30 days late.
