RE: Countywide Integrated Waste Management Plan 2022 Five-Year Review Report

The County of San Bernardino Department of Public Works - Solid Waste Management Division (SWMD) is preparing to review the Countywide Integrated Waste Management Plan (CIWMP) and develop the Five-Year Review Report, which is due for submittal to the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) by November 19, 2022. As such SWMD is seeking review of the CIWMP from all jurisdictions represented on the Solid Waste Advisory Task Force (SWAT) (includes all cities and towns within the County). It is requested that a representative from SWAT be selected to consolidate all suggested revisions into a single document for transmittal to SWMD. The intent is to have SWAT identify necessary revisions to the CIWMP so they can be incorporated into the Report. The Report is a comprehensive analysis regarding the continuing adequacy of the individual elements within the CIWMP (Source Reduction and Recycling Element [SRRE], Household Hazardous Waste Element [HHWE], Non-Disposal Facility Element [NDFE], Countywide Siting Element [CSE], and the Countywide Summary Plan [CSP]) that make up its waste management plan since these planning documents were first adopted (or last amended). Public Resources Code (PRC) Section 41822 requires that each jurisdiction within the County, and the County, review the CIWMP at least once every five years to:

- Identify any deficiencies in the elements of the Plan; and
- Review compliance with the source reduction and recycling requirements established under PRC Section 41780 (the 50% reduction requirement by 2000).

Some jurisdictions within the County maintain their own SRRE, HHWE, and NDFE so that they can address the complexities of their own integrated management needs within their jurisdiction by giving details on how they plan to achieve their required 50 percent diversion rate. Such documents shall be reviewed as part of the CIWMP Five-Year Review by the originating jurisdiction.

Based on the above requirements, SWMD would like to request your assistance in updating the required information for your jurisdiction in preparing the Five-Year Review Report for the CIWMP. Please review the enclosed documents, provide suggested revision and/or comments as necessary, and email Siva.Sivapalan@dpw.sbcounty.gov or mail comments to the address indicated above by Tuesday, January 18th, 2022.
