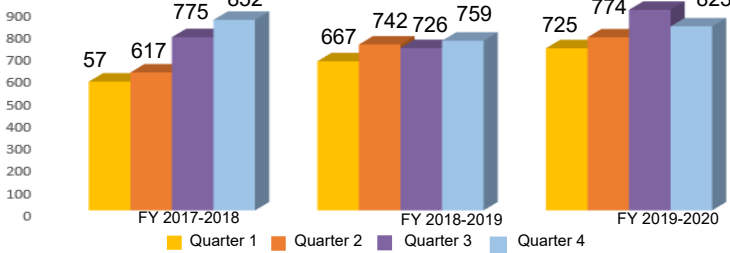

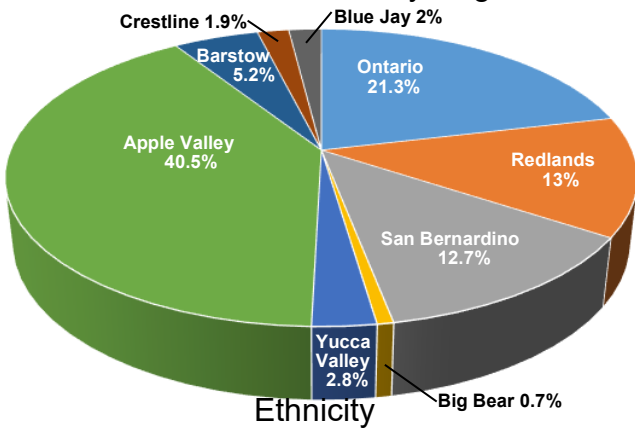

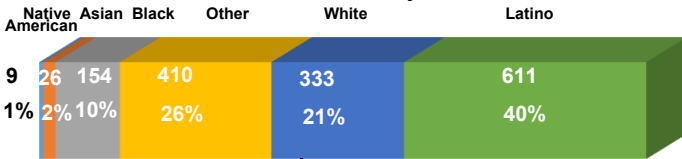
EIIS Clients Served By Quarter



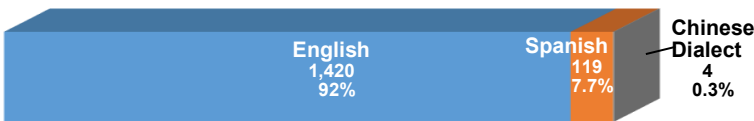
EIIS Clients Served By Region

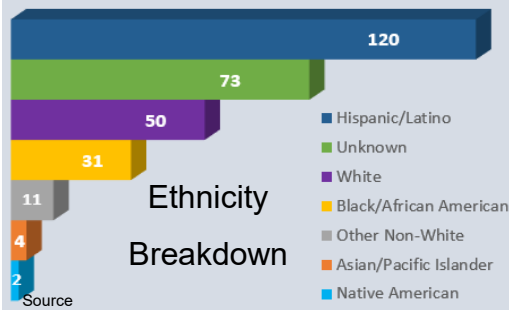


Who We See:

The EIIS program focuses on providing specialty mental health and attachment enrichment services to children ages 0 to their 9th birthday. These services are intended to improve the cognitive, emotional, behavioral, and developmental functioning of these children. In Fiscal Year 19/20, EIIS provided services to 1,543 unduplicated youth with over 46% of them residing in the High Desert region.

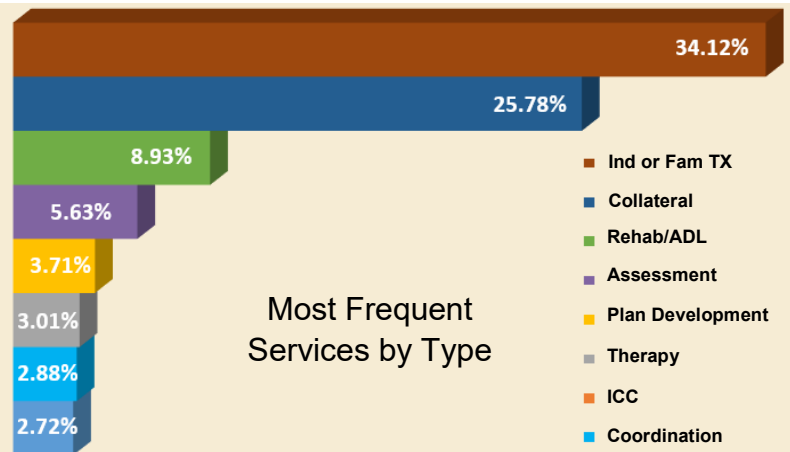
Ages and Stages Questionnaire

Core Needs at Intake



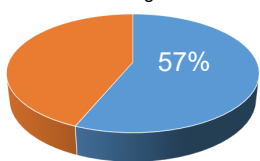
What We Do:

During FY 19/20, the EIIS program provided 3.5 hours of services during the first week of treatment and a little over 1 hour of weekly services during the remaining weeks. A majority of the services provided were Individual and/or Family Therapy (33%) and Collateral (31%). Services on average lasted four (4) months.

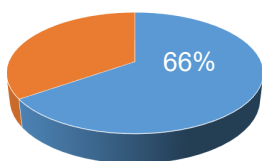


Most Frequent Services by Type

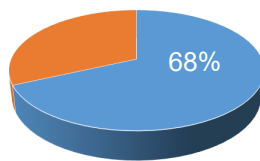
Improvement of Life Functioning Skills



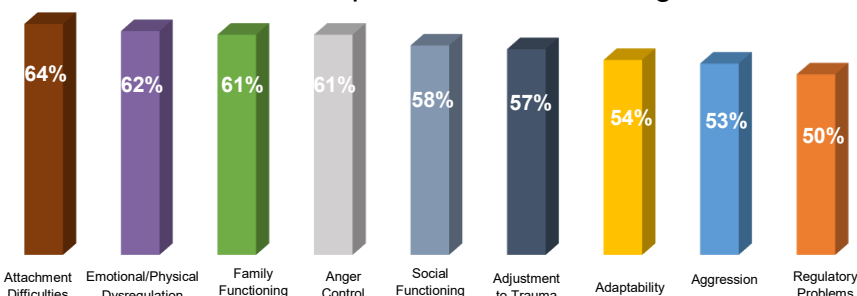
Improvement of Issues Specific to 0-5 Population

How We Help:

Of those youth who presented with core needs at intake and completed treatment during FY 19/20, 68% of the youth showed improvement. Approximately 58% of the youth who received services were ages 5 and younger. 66% of these youth showed improvement in issues specific to the 0-5 population such as adaptability, regulatory problems, and persistence.
