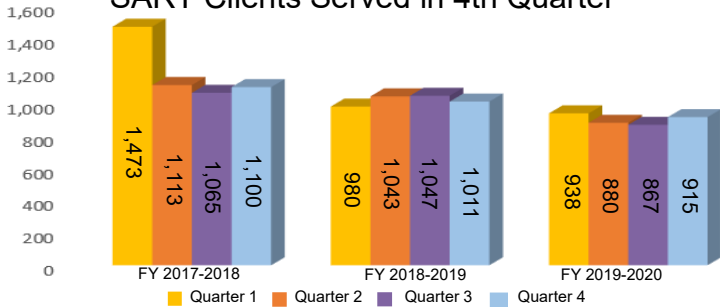


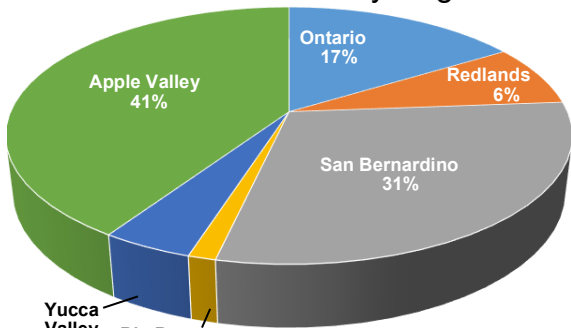

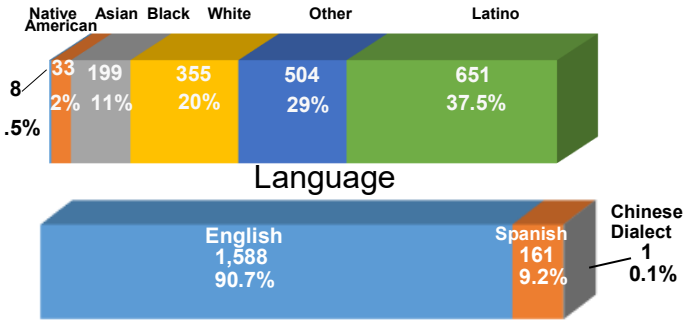
SART Clients Served in 4th Quarter

Ethnicity



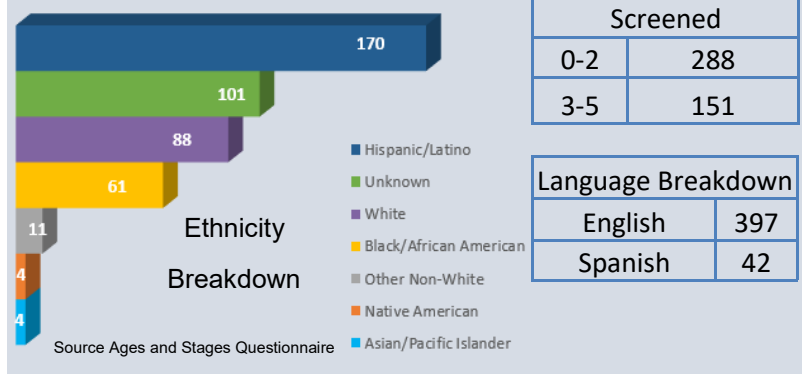

## Who We See:

SART serves children ages 0-6 who are experiencing social, physical, cognitive, behavioral, developmental, and/or psychological issues. It is an intensive program that provides services to at risk children, many who have been exposed to abuse, neglect and/or substances in utero. Approximately 54% of the youth served during Fiscal Year 19-20 were male and 55% were age 2 and younger.

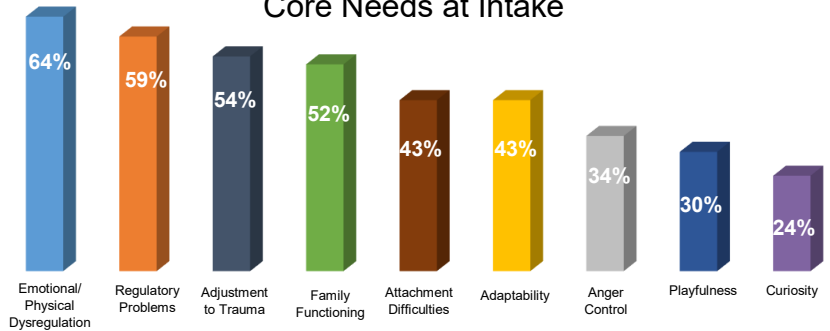

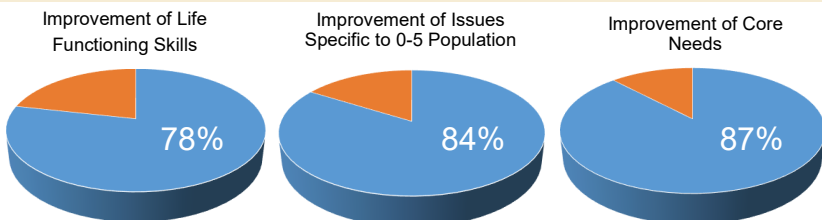
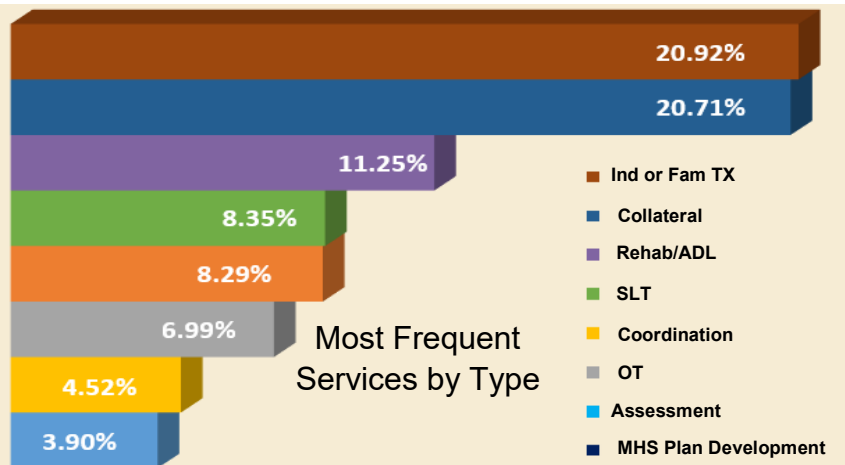

## Core Needs at Intake

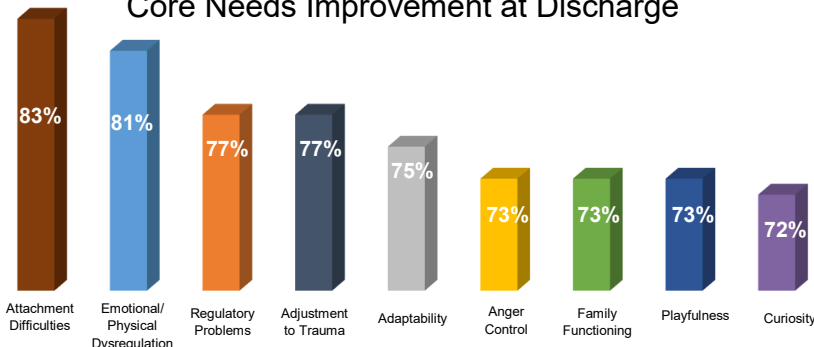


## What We Do:

SART uses a transdisciplinary approach to treatment, which includes screening, assessment, referral, and treatment by clinicians, pediatricians, public health nurses, occupational therapists, speech and language therapists, and pediatric neuropsychologists. On average, children receive about six (6) hours of services during the first week of treatment.

## How We Help:

Upon discharge from the SART programs, children displayed an 84% improvement in issues specific to the 0-5 population, which includes 83% improvement in Attachment Difficulties, 81% improvement in Physical/Emotional Dysregulation, 73% improvement in playfulness, and a 72% improvement in Curiosity. Overall, the children showed an 88% improvement in the number of needs they were experiencing at intake.
