Kathleen answered that each dose is four milligrams. Dr. Sequeira answered that overdosing on NARCAN isn’t possible and using it on someone is covered by the Good Samaritan Act.</li> <li>• Diana Alexander asked what the shelf-life is on NARCAN. Kathleen answered that each dose is good for two years.</li> <li>• Jeany Zepeda mentioned that Children and Family Services is discussing more options regarding NARCAN. CFS social workers can voluntarily carry NARCAN.</li> <li>• Kathleen mentioned that exposure to fentanyl mostly happens by inhalation. Dr. Sequeira added that most masks do not screen out the fentanyl fumes.</li> <li>• Chris Darby asked if non-profits and community partners can get NARCAN from the Probation Department. Kathleen said yes, but they would need to go through their chain of command.</li> </ul>
