## PSD Finance Request for Shared Governance Board Approval of Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) Applications

### 1. FY2017-18 (PY03) Head Start/Early Head Start Award (09CH10016-03)

San Bernardino County Preschool Services Department (PSD) is requesting approval to submit an application for a Fiscal Year 2017-18 COLA in the amount of \$429,844 which represents a 1.0 percent increase of the FY 2016 base funding. This application is being submitted in response to the funding guidance letter dated June 2, 2017 and requests \$382,773 for Head Start (CAN G094122) and \$47,071 for Early Head Start (CAN G094125). PSD intends to utilize the funding to pay for increases in the Personnel (contract staff hourly rate), Fringe Benefits, and Contractual budget categories.

## 2. FY2017-18 (PY03) Early Head Start-Child Care Partnership Award (09HP0001-03)

San Bernardino County Preschool Services Department (PSD) is requesting approval to submit an application for a Fiscal Year 2017-18 COLA in the amount of \$17,892 which represents a 1.0 percent increase of the FY 2016 base funding (CAN G095128). This application is being submitted in response to the funding guidance letter dated June 2, 2017 and PSD intends to utilize the funding to pay for increases in the Personnel (contract staff hourly rate), Fringe Benefits, and Contractual budget categories.
