Argument in Favor of Measure
Please vote yes on Measure, the marijuana business tax.
In 1996, California voters authorized the legal use of medical marijuana. As a result, California tax authorities estimate that the state currently collects \$58 million to \$105 million in sales taxes on \$700 million to \$1.3 billion in annual retail sales of medical marijuana.
Currently, the City of Needles ("City") of over 4,800 people, is not collecting any revenue from retail sales of medical marijuana. In order for the City to collect revenue, you need to vote "yes' to tax these facilities as other cities and states have done. All revenues collected will be deposited in the general fund and subject to existing independent financial audits, with all revenue controlled by the City.
Today, there are no financial audits of these facilities and/or retail sales of medical marijuana Just as over-the-counter drugs from pharmacies are subject to taxation, so too is medical marijuana. With a yes vote on Measure, facilities selling medical marijuana will be required to have financial audits and pay taxes like everyone else. Voting yes or Measure will bring revenue to the City to help balance the budget and fund City services like road paving, libraries, police, fire, parks and senior programs.
The United States Supreme Court has ruled that as a general matter, the unlawfulness of ar activity does not prevent its taxation. Therefore, in California, sales of medical marijuana including illegal marijuana, are subject to tax. Voting yes on Measure does not legalize or otherwise permit marijuana businesses in the City.
