In the current "at large" system, candidates for City Council may live anywhere in the City and voters from throughout the City vote for all members of the City Council. In the "by district" system proposed in Measure T, the City would be divided into five (5) councilmanic districts. Only the voters in each district would elect a member of the City Council who is a resident of that district. The boundaries of the proposed districts are set forth in Measure T. If adopted by the voters in November of 2014, the "by district" election system would commence with the regular municipal elections in 2016, and continue thereafter. No existing term of a member of the City Council would be shortened if this measure is adopted.
