

Vote No on Measure H!

None of the information put on this ballot by the School Board members shows the actual cost of the projects they propose. They have no firm price, except that our taxes will go up!

Property owners are currently paying for multiple School Bonds: Alta Loma School District from 1999-2026 with 10 years left. We also have two Chaffey Joint Union Bonds, one will end in 11 years the other in approx. 47 years. Now ALSD wants more debt, bonds, and increased taxes.

Maintenance and scheduled replacement for roofs, plumbing, electrical, heating/air conditioning etc. should be in the annual budget each year.

Building new facilities at this time is a hardship for the elderly and families struggling with less money, considering the slow economy.

Will any of these funds improve our children's education? Each District volunteered to take the Common Core (CCSS) into our schools without knowing the costs. Each is now responsible for new curriculum (that wasn't written yet), teacher retraining (that wasn't written yet), upgraded bandwidth, Wi-Fi, routers, and computer equipment for each student. Keep in mind that computer equipment needs to be upgraded every 2-3 years, possibly might be stretch to 5 years! Will this be budgeted for or will they want a new bond in 5 years for new and upgraded equipment? We pay large amounts of money for the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC) for their testing, which was not written or tested before we asked our children to take their experimental test.

Should we encumber our property for another experiment in our children's education?
