- 3. Respondents shall file a return to this Writ demonstrating compliance with Section 1-A above and serve it on all parties no later than 10 days after the date of the Writ's issuance.
- 4. Respondent's returns to this Writ must establish that Respondent has complied with this Writ.
- 5. This Writ may be served upon Respondent pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure Section 1011, 1012, or 1013, as Petitioners elect.
