2021 California Gubernatorial Recall Election **Post-Election Logic and Accuracy Test**

The public is invited to observe the Post-Election Logic and Accuracy Test of the County's highspeed ballot scanners, precinct ballot scanners and vote tabulation system used in the 2021 California Gubernatorial Recall Election. Testing will begin at 9 a.m. on Monday, October 18, 2021, and will continue until complete.

The Registrar of Voters tests the performance and accuracy of the voting system software and equipment three separate times for each election:

- 1. Before voting begins, pre-marked test ballots are run through the ballot scanners to make sure they total the votes accurately.
- 2. During the election canvass period, the paper ballots from at least one percent of the precincts and one percent of the mail ballots are randomly selected and hand counted to audit the accuracy of the ballot scanners.
- 3. After the election results are certified, the pre-marked test ballots are run through the ballot scanners again to make sure they still total the votes accurately.

The first test was conducted on August 12, 2021. This test showed no discrepancies in the test ballot counting. The second test began on September 22 and concluded on September 23, 2021. The hand count results were consistent with the machine count.

The Post-Election Logic and Accuracy is the third and final test of the County's voting system software and equipment. This test is observable by any person. If you are interested in observing or have questions about this public event, you may call the Registrar of Voters office at (909) 387-8300.
