

San Bernardino County Firefighters Respond to Vegetation Fire Friday Afternoon in Hesperia

HESPERIA, Calif. (VVNG.com) — **San Bernardino County Firefighters** worked quickly to knock down a vegetation fire that broke out on a hillside on Friday afternoon in the City of Hesperia.

It happened at about 4:12 pm, on June 2, 2023, near Chase Avenue and the fire posed an initial threat to nearby homes at the top of the hill on Danbury Avenue.

County Firefighters acted quickly and thanks to their quick actions the situation was quickly brought under control and contained.

Officials said the fire burned approximately 3.8 acres before it was completely extinguished.

Firefighters remained on scene for several hours to fully mop up and extinguish hot spots. Hand crew firefighters established containment lines around the perimeter to further control the fire.

"During this fire, additional incidents broke out in the high desert region which required multiple cover engines from our valley division to maintain service coverage in our high desert stations," stated fire officials.

SBC Fire Safety Message:

As we enter the summer months, it is crucial for everyone to remain vigilant and take necessary precautions to prevent wildfires. San Bernardino County Fire Department encourages residents to follow these essential wildland safety guidelines:

Create a defensible space around your property by clearing brush and vegetation at least 100 feet from your home.

b Properly maintain your property by regularly removing dead vegetation, leaves, and debris.

b Dispose of cigarettes, matches, and other flammable materials in designated containers.

b Avoid outdoor activities that may cause sparks or ignite fires during periods of high fire danger.

b Report any signs of smoke or fire immediately by dialing 911.

By adhering to these guidelines, we can collectively contribute to the safety and well-being of our community.

Trapped Driver, Overturned Truck, Multiple Injuries

On May 28th, 2023, at about 2:11 AM, CHP, **San Bernardino County Fire**, and AMR responded to a reported traffic collision on the Northbound 215 Freeway, just South of University Parkway in San Bernardino.

The first arriving units located a sedan with major damage and a female driver still trapped inside the vehicle. There was also an overturned flatbed truck with pallets.

After a lengthy extrication, the female driver was transported to a hospital. Three parties were inside the flatbed truck, and all were transported with unknown injuries. No other information was provided at the scene.

Tractor-trailer hauling tortillas overturns on northbound I-15 freeway in Hesperia

HESPERIA, Calif (VVNG.com) — A tractor-trailer transporting Mission Tortillas overturned on the northbound I-15 early Saturday morning resulting in a full freeway closure.

It happened at about 5:18 am, on June 3, 2023, on the NB I-15, just south of the US Highway 395 overpass in the City of Hesperia.

For reasons still under investigation, the J.B. Hunt Transportation tractor-trailer combination struck the K-rail along the right-hand shoulder and subsequently overturned onto its side.

The fully-loaded trailer broke open and Mission Tortilla packages along with plastic container bins scattered across all lanes.

The driver was able to self-extricate from the truck and was not injured.

At about 5:25 am, a SIG ALERT was issued and all northbound lanes were closed for an unknown duration. Vehicles were detoured off at Ranchero Road and motorists used Mariposa Road as an alternate route resulting in a complete traffic jam.

People reported being stuck in the freeway traffic for approximately 3 hours. At 8:21 am, CHP reported one lane was open.

The cause of the accident is under investigation by the California Highway Patrol Victorville Station.
