NEW FIRE ENGINE COMING TO STATION 36 IN JOSHUA TREE

A new fire engine is making its way to Joshua Tree. Last week, Assistant Chief Tuttle and County Fire staff completed a final inspection on new Engine 36, housed in Joshua Tree. Staff went over every inch of the new Kovatch Mechanical Equipment (KME) Severe Service Type I engine to ensure the apparatus was up to specification. The new 2022 Engine was purchased utilizing Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding. The new apparatus will replace a 2010 apparatus which will be moved to "reserve" status.

"San Bernardino County Fire District is committed to providing premier Fire, Rescue and EMS services while maintaining fiscal responsibility. Through grant funding, County Fire was able to purchase this new fire engine with the latest technology and safety features. We look forward to seeing it serve the residents and visitors of Joshua Tree" according to Assistant Chief Tuttle, who oversees Fire / EMS for San Bernardino County in the Morongo Basin.


The new engine is capable of pumping 1500 gallons (GPM), holds 500 gallons of water, and has a full equipment complement to support County Fire's all-risk service delivery. The new engine (one of five Countywide) will be delivered in the near future to County Fire's shop in San Bernardino. Once there, the apparatus will get radios, equipment mounted and decals installed prior to being placed into service.

NEWS2-vehicle crash reported with major damage in Cajon Pass Thursday night

Cajon Pass, San Bernardino, Calif. (VVNG.com) — A two-vehicle traffic collision with both vehicles sustaining major damage was reported late Thursday night in the Cajon Pass.

At about 11:21 p.m., 911 operators received a call referencing a black SUV driving the wrong way on the 15 Freeway. According to the CHP logs, the SUV was traveling southbound in the northbound lanes when the collision occurred just south of Cleghorn.

As a result of the crash, one vehicle overturned and came to rest approximately 200 feet west of the freeway, and a second vehicle with major damage remained on the freeway facing the wrong way, according to the logs. Witnesses reported that the occupants of the overturned SUV were conscious and yelling, and one occupant complained of a possible broken arm, or an injury to their arm as they attempted to exit the vehicle.

San Bernardino County Fire arrived on scene and determined that the occupants of both vehicles only sustained minor injuries. A tow truck was requested to remove both vehicles from the roadway. San Bernardino County Fire reported that two people with minor injuries were transported to Arrowhead Regional Medical Center. A stretch of N. Cajon Blvd was closed as a tow truck removed the vehicle.
