NEEDLES — San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department/Needles Police Department held the third annual Trunk or Treat event in the Recreation Center parking lot on Oct. 26.

It also provided families and kids an enjoyable evening with carnival-style games, candy and goodies while meeting their friends and neighbors along the way.

"Last year's was good, was better than the year before," said Misti Hunt, SBCSD service specialist.

This year, she said, was even better.

San Bernardino County Fire Department Needles Station 32, Baker Ambulance, California Highway Patrol and Colorado River Medical Center joined SBCSD for the evening's events.

Drugbusters also participated in not only handing out candy to the trunk or treaters, but also provided a flyer with Halloween safety tips and facts of things to be wary of prior to consuming candy.

"A lot of people participating," Hunt said. "It's nice to see that."

The Bullhead City Target also participated.

"Usually Target just donates," Hunt said. "Like Walmart, they donate. That's how we get funding, through donations. Target did their own this year (by setting up a candy-distribution display). We're excited to have them join."

Mackenzie Mateljan, executive team leader human resources for Target in Bullhead City, said the Target employees had never participated in this event in person.

"We haven't really got out and interacted with the community as much as we'd like to ever since COVID started, so we're really excited to get some face time," she said.

3 Vehicle Crash Blocked The Bypass Lane Southbound I-15 In Hesperia Halloween Afternoon

HESPERIA, CA. (Pain In The Pass) >> A three-vehicle crash had traffic backed up from the bypass lane on southbound Interstate 15 Freeway for miles in Hesperia sent one to the hospital, officials said.

California Highway Patrol and **San Bernardino County Fire** Department responded to the traffic collision involving three vehicles. The vehicles involving were a gray Dodge Charger with damage, a red Chevrolet Silverado pickup truck with front-end damage. The third vehicle was an white Acura RDX. The crash took place at about 1:49pm Monday October 31, 2022 on new bypass lane on southbound I-15 between Ranchero Road and Main Street.

Rescue crews arrived on scene, they located two vehicles with major damage. The bypass lane was blocked for about a hour. One person was reported to be transported by a ambulance with minor injuries to a nearby hospital.

Traffic was backup all the way down to Palmdale Road.

We will update this story with more information when the CHP's preliminary accident report is available. Additional details were limited at this time. This incident will be under investigation by the California Highway Patrol Victorville Office.
