## RIVERSIDE-SAN BERNARDINO-ONTARIO METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREA (MSA) (RIVERSIDE AND SAN BERNARDINO COUNTIES) Nonfarm employment up 6,200 over the month and 76,100 over the year

The unemployment rate in the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario MSA was 7.9 percent in June 2021, up from a revised 7.2 percent in May 2021, and below the year-ago estimate of 13.3 percent. This compares with an unadjusted unemployment rate of 8.0 percent for California and 6.1 percent for the nation during the same period. The unemployment rate was 7.9 percent in Riverside County, and 8.0 percent in San Bernardino County.

Between May 2021 and June 2021, total nonfarm employment grew from 1,521,700 to 1,527,900, an increase of 6,200 jobs. Agricultural employment grew by 2,300 jobs

- Leisure and hospitality (up 3,700) recorded the largest payroll increase over the month.

Accommodation and food services (up 3,900) accounted for the entire job gain. Within accommodation and food services, food services and drinking places (up 3,400) recorded the largest employment increase, while accommodation added 500 jobs over the month. Arts, entertainment, and recreation cut payrolls by 200 jobs.

- Educational and health services (up 2,500) increased payrolls over the month, where healthcare and social assistance (up 3,500) recorded the entire gain, while educational services receded by 1,000 jobs.
- Additional employment gains were recorded in trade, transportation, and utilities (up 1,600 ), professional and business services (up 1,200), other services (up 700), and information (up 200).
- The following sectors recorded job losses over the month: construction (down 1,500), government (down 1,200), financial activities (down 800), and manufacturing (down 200).

Between June 2020 and June 2021, total nonfarm employment increased by 76,100 (up 5.2 percent). Agricultural employment grew by 200 (up 1.2 percent).

- Trade, transportation, and utilities led the year-over increase, adding 35,600 jobs. The upswing was noted in transportation, warehousing, and utilities (up 20,700), retail trade (up 12,700), and wholesale trade (up 2,200).
- Educational and health services added 17,500 jobs over the year. Employment gains were recorded in healthcare and social assistance (up 16,200) and educational services (up 1,300).
- Additional year-over employment gains occurred in the following sectors: leisure and hospitality (up 11,400 ), professional and business services (up 10,200), construction (up 3,900), other services (up 2,100 ), and information (up 400).
- Three nonfarm sectors reported job losses over the year: manufacturing (down 3,000), government (down 1,500), and financial activities (down 500).
