## RIVERSIDE-SAN BERNARDINO-ONTARIO METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREA (MSA) (RIVERSIDE AND SAN BERNARDINO COUNTIES) Nonfarm employment down 13,400 over the month but up 79,500 over the year

The unemployment rate in the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario MSA was 7.9 percent in July 2021, down from a revised 8.0 percent in June 2021, and below the year-ago estimate of 12.9 percent. This compares with an unadjusted unemployment rate of 7.9 percent for California and 5.7 percent for the nation during the same period. The unemployment rate was 7.9 percent in Riverside County, and 8.0 percent in San Bernardino County.

Between June 2021 and July 2021, total nonfarm employment decreased from 1,531,200 to 1,517,800, a decrease of 13,400 jobs. Agricultural employment decreased by 2,700 jobs.

- Government (down 13,900 ) recorded the largest payroll decrease over the month. Local government educational services (down 12,600) and state government educational services (down 1,500) accounted for all the job loss. Federal government added 100 jobs over the month.
- Trade, transportation, and utilities (up 3,600) recorded the largest payroll increase over the month. All the job gain was reported in wholesale trade (up 1,300), transportation and warehousing (up 1,300), and retail trade (up 1,000).
- Leisure and hospitality (up 1,900) increased payrolls over the month. Accommodation and food services (up 1,500) and arts, entertainment, and recreation (up 400) accounted for all the job gain. Within accommodation and food services, food services and drinking places (up 1,300 ) was responsible for 86.6 percent of the employment gain.
- Information (up 200) was the only other sector that recorded job gains. Mining and logging and other services did not change over the month. Additional employment losses were recorded in the following sectors: construction (down 2,600), professional and business services (down 1,300), manufacturing (down 700), educational and health services (down 400), and financial activities (down 200).

Between July 2020 and July 2021, total nonfarm employment increased by 79,500 (up 5.5 percent). Agricultural employment decreased by 800 (down 5.2 percent).

- Trade, transportation, and utilities led the year-over increase, adding 35,100 jobs. The payroll increase was noted in transportation, warehousing, and utilities (up 23,100), retail trade (up 9,600), and wholesale trade (up 2,400).
- Leisure and hospitality advanced payrolls by 18,400 over the year. Accommodation and food services accounted for all the job gain (up 18,500), whereas arts, entertainment, and recreation (down 100) reported a job loss.
- Additional year-over employment gains occurred in the following sectors: educational and health services (up 16,200 ), professional and business services (up 9,100 ), construction (up 4,000 ), other services (up 1,000), and information (up 500).
- Mining and logging remained unchanged over the year, but the following sectors reported employment losses: manufacturing (down 2,200), government (down 1,400), and financial activities (down 1,200).
