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## RIVERSIDE-SAN BERNARDINO-ONTARIO METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREA (MSA) (RIVERSIDE AND SAN BERNARDINO COUNTIES) <br> Nonfarm employment up 3,500 over the month and 91,900 over the year

The unemployment rate in the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario MSA was 3.9 percent in September 2022, down from a revised 4.3 percent in August 2022, and below the year-ago estimate of 6.4 percent. This compares with an unadjusted unemployment rate of 3.7 percent for California and 3.3 percent for the nation during the same period. The unemployment rate was 4.0 percent in Riverside County, and 3.8 percent in San Bernardino County.

Between August 2022 and September 2022, total nonfarm employment increased from 1,661,600 to $1,665,100$, an increase of 3,500 jobs. Agricultural employment increased by 800 jobs.

- Government added the most jobs over the month increasing by 4,800 jobs. Ninety percent of the job growth was registered in local government (up 4,300), followed by gains in state government (up 600), and offset by losses in federal government (down 100).
- Three other sectors increased over the month: other services (up 1,600), educational and health services (up 1,200), and trade, transportation, and utilities (up 1,200).
- Construction posted the largest month-over loss (down 2,200). Specialty trade contractors (down 1,600 ) lost the most jobs within the sector followed by losses in construction of buildings and heavy and civil engineering construction, both losing 300 jobs each.
- Leisure and hospitality cut back over the month losing 1,300 jobs. Accommodation and food services (down 1,500 ) made up all of the job loss. Arts, entertainment, and recreation offset the decline with a gain of 200 jobs.
- Four other sectors declined over the month: Professional and business services (down 1,100), manufacturing (down 300), financial activities, (down 300), and information (down 100). Mining and logging remained unchanged.

Between September 2021 and September 2022, total nonfarm employment increased by 91,900, a 5.8 percent change. Agricultural employment decreased by 100 jobs, or 0.7 percent.

- Trade, transportation, and utilities (up 30,900 ) contributed 34 percent of the total nonfarm over the year job change. Transportation, warehousing, and utilities (up 22,000) accounted for 71 percent of the overall industry growth. Wholesale trade (up 4,600) and retail trade (up 4,300) completed the increase.
- Leisure and hospitality gained 17,600 jobs. The majority of the expansion was in accommodation and food services (up 16,800), followed by arts, entertainment, and recreation (up 800).
- Eight other industries increased over the year including educational and health services (up 13,600 ), professional and business services (up 10,500), and government (up 9,400).
- Mining and logging was the only nonfarm industry to decline over the year (down 100).
