6) Homeless Services

Dan Flores, Executive Director of Mary's Mercy Center provided an overview of services provided to individuals who are homeless. He provided statistical information regarding the number of individuals that are homeless (sheltered vs. unsheltered); the cities; numbers of individuals that were homeless in 2020 the ages/gender of those individuals and the subpopulations of those that are currently homeless. Mr. Flores reviewed their transitional housing programs available; resident profile and considerations for employment.

Mariann Johnson provided an overview of the current work plan for the Special Populations Committee. She reviewed the four goals that included: Facilitate funding and partnership opportunities that enhance access and delivery of services for individuals with significant barriers to employment; Develop a business engagement strategy that results in employment and work experience opportunities for all special populations; Identify any legislative or policy priorities that impact special populations and employment. Develop strategy for pursuing legislative or policy changes as needed; and lastly, Improve AJCC access and delivery of services for adults with Intellectual/Developmental disabilities.
