WHAT IS THE **COMBINED GIVING** CAMPAIGN

The **Combined Giving Campaign** serves an important purpose in supporting several elements of the Countywide Vision by providing a means for the County to collaborate with charitable organizations, engaging our employees in charitable endeavors, and making a difference to our community by providing resources to our residents.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How many charities may I contribute to through the Combined Giving Campaign?

There is no limit to the number of charities that you can contribute to through the Combined Giving Campaign.

What is the minimum and maximum amount that I can contribute?

The minimum contribution amount is \$1.00. There is no maximum contribution amount set by the County; however you should consult with your tax professional regarding the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) maximum charitable donation amount that can be claimed on your taxes.

Are my contributions tax deductible?

Your contributions are 100% tax deductible. Payroll deductions are taken on an after-tax basis, but can be claimed when filing your personal income taxes. The Year-to-Date total on your last paycheck of the year should be used as the amount to claim on your taxes. A printed copy of that same paycheck serves as documentation to include with your tax filing.

Can I contribute to Combined Giving outside of the designated Campaign month?

Absolutely! You can start, stop, or change your Combined Giving Elections at any time throughout the year.

How do I stop my contributions?

To stop an existing election, you may log into <u>EMACS Self-Service</u> and stop your deduction, or complete the "<u>Combined Giving Contribution Election</u> <u>Agreement</u>." Review the <u>Combined Giving EMACS Self-Service Instructions</u> or <u>Video</u> located on the <u>Combined Giving Website</u> for additional guidance.

How do I change an existing election?

To change an existing election, you may log into <u>EMACS Self-Service</u> and change your deduction, or complete the "<u>Combined Giving Contribution Election</u> <u>Agreement</u>." Review the <u>Combined Giving EMACS Self-Service Instructions</u> or <u>Video</u> located on the <u>Combined Giving Website</u> for additional guidance.

How does the "Your Choice" option work?

The "Your Choice" option allows you to contribute to a charity that holds an Internal Revenue Service (IRS) exemption as a 501(c)(3) charitable organization that are not listed in this brochure. Please confirm with your charity that they qualify before starting your contributions.

A "<u>Combined Giving Contribution Election Agreement</u>" is required to designate a "Your Choice" agency. Contributions are processed by an umbrella agency, such as America's Charity, United Way or Earth Share. Indicate the umbrella agency and the corresponding "Your Choice" agency code ending in "98". For example, if you select America's Charity as the umbrella agency, you would put "8098" as the agency code. Complete the "Your Choice" section with the contact details for your chosen charitable agency.

You can start, update or stop a "Your Choice" election option in <u>EMACS Self-Service</u>. Note that if you start a "Your Choice" election without completing a "<u>Combined Giving Contribution Election Agreement</u>," the contribution will remain with the umbrella agency.

How do I make a one-time contribution?

You may make a one-time donation through payroll deduction by logging into your <u>EMACS Self-Service</u> or by completing the "<u>Combined Giving Campaign</u> <u>One-Time Deduction</u>" form. To make a one-time donation in EMACS Self-Service, you will need to start your donation for the pay period of your choice and stop your deduction in the pay period of your choice. Review the <u>Combined Giving EMACS Self-Service Instructions</u> or <u>Video</u> located on the <u>Combined</u> <u>Giving Website</u> for additional guidance.

How often are my contributions sent?

Contributions are deducted from paychecks and sent to the agencies designated on a bi-weekly basis.



Today, more than 50 Peer Supporters service approximately 1,400 employees. Peer Supporters are selected based upon their overall ability to assist and remain free of judgment, and most importantly, their ability and commitment to maintain confidentiality. Once trained, Peer Supporters are called upon to offer information and support related to stress management and post-traumatic injuries following critical incidents including, but not limited to, officer involved shootings, severe injury, child deaths, staff or family suicides, and death of employees or family members. For the past 12 years, employees have generously given of their time, energy, and money to help alleviate some of the burdens faced by their peers.
