High recidivism rate of 67% for 2010; SB County can improve this percentage.

Concern expressed re group homes. State has several contracts with group homes/residential facilities. These facilities are not licensed and not regulated. County would have no local control. Ex Committee recommended that Workgroup Committee fight back w/state. State not paying us for housing.
