# U.S. Dept. of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Actions

- ❑ Unprecedented Action
- ❑ *Announced Competition – June 22, 2022*
  - NOFO focused on Unsheltered and Rural Homelessness
- ❑ Identified Areas that Qualify as Rural
- ❑ *Published Funding Available to each CoC and Rural Area*
- ❑ *Hosted Webinar to Answer Questions – August 11, 2022*
- ❑ *Preleased Application Packets and CoC Guidance*
- ❑ *Established an 'help desk' to ask questions*
- ❑ *Made resources available on the HUD Exchange*

# NOFO “BIG PICTURE”

- ▶ Two funds in one NOFO
  - One for UNSHELTERED homeless
  - One for RURAL Homelessness
  
- HIGHLY Competitive
  - Maximum of 10 CoCs funded in a state
  - CA has 44 CoCs

# What's in the NOFO for our CoC?

- ▶ San Bernardino CoC can apply for:
  - \$15,642,926 Unsheltered Funds
  - \$0 Rural Funds
  - Applications are due to HUD no later than October 20<sup>th</sup> **BUT there are other local due dates in order to get maximum points from HUD. At least 30 days ahead.**
  - See Local Applications timeline.

# How will the CoC be chosen? (1)

- ▶ The NOFO describes the purposes and goals for these funds
- ▶ Evaluated based on how the CoC will meet these purposes and goals
  - **Reduce Unsheltered Homelessness in areas of greatest need (based on 2019 PITC)**
  - Provide Assistance on Tribal lands
  - **Expanding housing opportunities, leveraging healthcare**
  - Advance equity for over-represented/under-served groups
  - **Include persons with Lived Experience in homelessness**
  - Employ a housing first approach

# How will the CoC be chosen? (2)

## MAJOR points:

- **Focus on persons with Severe Service Needs**
  - **Leverage Housing and Healthcare Resource that are not CoC or ESG**
    - **50% of total housing requests\***
    - **50% of health care services not paid for by CoC or ESG\***
  - **Partner with Public Housing Authorities**
  - **Create a 15-page community plan (70 of 100 points)**
- ▶ NOFO Provides an outline detailing the rating factors that add up to 100 points, lists the number of points available, and how to receive maximum points. (starts on page 40)

# What are Severe Service Needs?

Any combination of factors:

- ▶ Facing significant challenges / functional impairment
  - ▶ Physical, mental, developmental, or behavioral health difficulties regardless of the type of disability
  - ▶ Requires a significant level of support to maintain permanent housing (level of support not the disability)
  - ▶ High utilization of crisis or emergency services to meet basic needs (Emergency rooms, jails, psychiatric centers)
    - History of living unsheltered, repeated or continuously
    - Vulnerable to illness or death
    - Vulnerability to victimization (assault, trafficking, or sex work)



# Eligible Project Types- Unsheltered NOFO

- ▶ Permanent Supportive Housing
- ▶ Rapid rehousing
- ▶ Support services only – Coordinated Entry
- ▶ Support services only – Other\*
- ▶ Joint TH-RRH Projects
- ▶ HMIS
- ▶ CoC Planning Costs (3% maximum)

# Rules about Project Activities

Must be NEW project or services – not existing

Cannot replace other funding (local, state, etc.)

Cannot be acquisition, rehab, new construction

All grants are for 3-years

Must be operational by September 2024

Provide 25% match in addition to the housing or healthcare leveraging resources

# Who can apply for Project Grants?

- ▶ The organization selected by the CoC as the Collaborative Applicant must submit the 3-part Application Package on behalf of the CoC.
- ▶ Units of Government, non-profit organizations, and tribal territories are potential applicants, subject to Threshold Review. For-Profit organizations and Individuals are not eligible to apply.
  - Threshold reviews of the Applicant Organization and the Proposed Project
  - If the Applicant or the Project do not meet threshold requirements, HUD will not fund the project.

# What is in the Application to HUD?

- ▶ The Application Package consists of
  - Consolidated Application (region-wide application) and required attachments
  - Priority Listing giving the rank-order of projects approved by the CoC to be included in the application package to HUD
  - Listing also shows projects that were not selected
- ▶ Copies of each application and required attachments

# How do I get my project included?

- ▶ HUD requires the local CoC conduct a Threshold Review and to review, score, and rank all applications from eligible Organizations for eligible projects.
- ▶ The details of this process will be covered in another presentation.

# What is in the Application for my Project?

- ▶ HUD created a Project Application
- ▶ The Project Application is in HUDs electronic system, called *E-snaps*
- ▶ Follow the instructions given by the CoC on how to complete and submit your project application for local rating and ranking
- ▶ To be sent to HUD, all Project Applications and the required document need to be prepared in e-Snaps and pulled into the Priority Listing by the Collaborative Applicant
