In September 2007, the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP) was formed to provide a more focused approach to our goal of ending homelessness within the County. The Partnership consists of city governments, community based organizations, faith-based organizations, educational institutes, non-profit organizations, private industry, and federal, state, and local government.

SBCHP was developed to promote a strong collaboration between agencies to direct the planning, development, and implementation of the County's 10-year-plan to end chronic homelessness. The Partnership meets on the third Wednesday of each month at the Behavioral Health Resource Center in Rialto. The Partnership facilitates better communication, planning, coordination, and cooperation among all entities that provide services and/or resources for the relief of homelessness in San Bernardino County.

Mission Statement

The Mission of the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership is to provide a system of care that is inclusive, well planned, coordinated and evaluated and is accessible to all who are homeless and those at-risk of becoming homeless.

Reentry Specialist helps clients overcome barriers to reentry by providing relevant resource and referrals. • Doesn't give false hope and gives detailed information. Doesn't provide direct services. They are not case managers. • Food, Clothing, Shelter, Housing, Transportation, Employment etc. are common connections. • They have other internal partnerships such as Preschool Specialist and Children, Family Services (CFS) specialist, 0-5 Specialist and a Veteran Specialist. • Outreach at various resources fairs and events. Uses the reentry line to let them know of things going on. • Additional 211 Projects - 211 Vetlink.org, Cal-Fresh and Medi-Cal Applications, Child abuse hotline, stronger hearts, bonus-lactation and CES (coming soon). • Goal is to prevent recidivism, empower and provide the most powerful tools of awareness and information. • Angelina Hernandez, 211 Reentry Specialist 909-204-6188. • If client can prove they have an interview or secure employment, they can receive a bus pass.

Funding went to 211 as an applicant. Recommendations are being made and plan will be drawn out. All agencies receiving CoC funding are highly encouraged to participate. Those that are not funded by the CoC can participant as well. • Ready to expand their homeless program. Wants to implement nutrition program, financial literacy, transitional job training, transitional housing, etc. • Has a reentry team working with probation and parole. Focus is on the homeless issue, pigging back on the HOPE team. • With so many people are on the verge of being homeless. They work with them ahead of time. When it comes to public benefits they intervene. Civil matters. • Time for Change is having their annual fundraiser. Everyone welcome to purchase a ticket. Can advertise business, silent auction. • There is now funding out there to help clients get the California ID and birth certificate for free. Link will be sent out. • Various flyers were placed in the back for rental assistance through ESG grant, mobile medical services, resource fair and VITA program to get taxes done.

Cold weather emergency shelter guide was created and can be given to homeless. If anyone would like to add to her brochure, contact her. NECON developed a transportation program to give one way bus passes to the homeless, so they can get to shelters. If you call the toll free number on the back of the shelter guide, updated shelter and weather information will be provided. No app on phone needed. • There are no VASH vouchers available in San Bernardino at this time however Riverside has a few left. Grant per diem turning to bridge housing. • One of the biggest issues is HUD's definition of chronically homeless. Only a percentage of HUD VASH has to meet chronic definition. • Foothill Aids Project will do presentation next meeting but a brochure was handed out. They provide all site social services for people who are impacted by HIV/AIDS such as rental assistance, mortgage assistance, utility assistance, motel/hotel assistance and has AB 109 program. • Think about our clients and their health. If they are at risk, are we a safe place to have discussions or to offer testing?
