In September 2007, the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP) was formed to provide a more focused approach to our goal of ending homelessness within the County. The Partnership consists of city governments, community based organizations, faith-based organizations, educational institutes, non-profit organizations, private industry, and federal, state, and local government.

SBCHP was developed to promote a strong collaboration between agencies to direct the planning, development, and implementation of the County's 10-year-plan to end chronic homelessness. The Partnership meets on the third Wednesday of each month at the Behavioral Health Resource Center in Rialto. The Partnership facilitates better communication, planning, coordination, and cooperation among all entities that provide services and/or resources for the relief of homelessness in San Bernardino County.

Mission Statement

The Mission of the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership is to provide a system of care that is inclusive, well planned, coordinated and evaluated and is accessible to all who are homeless and those at-risk of becoming homeless.

Domestic Violence and Homelessness	Shelly Levin	<p>Interpersonal Violence and Homelessness</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The traditional term is Domestic Violence and usually refers to heterosexual couples. With the expanded understanding of relationships in which violence occurs, the new term is Intimate Partner Violence (IPV). ▪ Some people identify as either Victim or Survivor. A Victim is usually someone who has recently experienced violence. A Survivor is someone who has been through recovery or is in the process of recovering. ▪ Between 22% and 57% of all homeless women report that IPV was the immediate cause of the homelessness. ▪ A brief history of IPV from where we have come from in prior to 1960 to present was given. ▪ Shelters are not long term solution ▪ Discussed a program called Home Free in Oregon for women who have experienced IPV.

There is a tremendous amount of outreach and engagement taking place with a small staff in place. Diversion and prevention should be our first step. We must help those that can help themselves. We are housing people who are homeless so think about the language we use. You can now text 898211 and put in zip code and you will receive a response. Has a partnership with TAD and can enroll in CalFresh over the phone.

Having a dual county homeless summit in March. Looking for vendors. Youth panel from Riverside & San Bernardino County. Mark Anthony will be the speaker. Has 200 registered so far. Daisy Esparz will be covering high desert.
	Lois Levitt	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ESG grant for City of Fontana currently has funding. Anyone homeless in the city of Fontana can go through CES who will send referral. For more information go to Water of Life website and pull up City Link.
	Kate Nazareno	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Inland Housing Solutions – continuing to take CES referrals for Rapid Rehousing Program for families with children.
	Debra Watkins	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> National Emergency Communication Organization Network (NECON) provides emergency shelter guides for all cities both incorporated and unincorporated. Distributed approximately 40,000 of the guides. Can send you artwork so can print yourself. Program focused on emergency preparedness for the homeless who are vulnerable in extreme heat/cold. Also has guides providing information/hotline for Domestic Violence, unescorted youth and veterans.
