In September 2007, the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP) was formed to provide a more focused approach to our goal of ending homelessness within the County. The Partnership consists of city governments, community based organizations, faith-based organizations, educational institutes, non-profit organizations, private industry, and federal, state, and local government.

SBCHP was developed to promote a strong collaboration between agencies to direct the planning, development, and implementation of the County's 10-year-plan to end chronic homelessness. The Partnership meets on the third Wednesday of each month at the Behavioral Health Resource Center in Rialto. The Partnership facilitates better communication, planning, coordination, and cooperation among all entities that provide services and/or resources for the relief of homelessness in San Bernardino County.

Mission Statement

The Mission of the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership is to provide a system of care that is inclusive, well planned, coordinated and evaluated and is accessible to all who are homeless and those at-risk of becoming homeless.

211/CES	Marisela Manzo	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Recently launched a Homeless Disability Advocacy Program (HDAP) for individuals with a chronic disability who are literally homeless and not receiving disability income. If they are working with a Permanent Supportive Housing provider and they are on the street they can be placed in motel for up to 90 days. This program will provide legal services to help the individual apply for social security and veterans to apply for veteran benefits. Training will be provided to entities who are tied into the program.
Pathways to Housing	Don Smith	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The Housing and search team (HIP Squad) is accepting referrals from Rapid Rehousing Providers who are providing case management and/or permanent supportive housing to help identify units for their clients. ▪ The Pathways to Housing Network is a search provider driven collective impact initiative created a couple years ago to coordinate the network better and try to streamline connections to resources. There is an online request form for providers and consumers to identify household makeup, current housing situation and the type of assistance they are seeking and those requests are sent to over 3 dozen partners throughout the county. Pathways does not have resources itself. Stats were collected from last year showing the characteristics of households. Majority were families with children. Working with CES on a structure to work more effectively between both systems.
ICH Report	Tom Hernandez	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The next ICH meeting is scheduled for June 27, 2018 in Rialto. The agenda has not been finalized yet but an IEHP presentation is tentatively scheduled as well as an update about the May revision for the

		<p>emergency homeless aid funding. Last meeting included all the reports from HPN and various groups and the consent calendar included an appointment of a new chair for the Bylaw's committee and amendments to HMIS policies and procedures. Tom mentioned the Governor's budget had 369 million for homeless related efforts and 250 million of that is going to emergency shelter services. It hasn't been determined who will oversee it yet but ICH would determine how money would be spent. The state will have to release the notice first. There was also a presentation on the RRH Policy Manual. It will be on agenda again for finalization. All CoC's are meeting Friday to review scoring, best practices and have the opportunity to meet William Snow. If want to be added to list serve email Amy to be added.</p>

COMMITTEE UPDATES		
211/CES	Gary Madden	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ HUD has certain requirements to continue receiving funding. In this county street outreach is critical and the Coordinated Entry System (CES) does most of the street outreach. They do coordinate with other agencies but they are looking to expand. Agencies were trying to do it on their own with minimal capacity. With CES, operators do most of the street outreach so agencies don't have to do so much anymore. They now have a team for housing search and placement and it is working well. They did a soft launch in November of 2016 and then were officially up and running in January of 2017. In 18 months they have completed over 2,500 assessments of clients to establish the vulnerability level. Those with highest need are at the top of the list. There are case conferencing meetings to go over the list. A total of 413 people in the last year have been housed. Since they started, 552 have been housed. Of those, 189 were veterans and 145 were chronically homeless. With this coordinated system they are now able to measure. Right now there are several referrals are out to various agency.

ICH Report	Tom Hernandez	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The last meeting was a special meeting in July. They voted on a number of things but there were no reports. There were six items on the agenda but they didn't get to last 2 because they lost a quorum. They created a Grant Review Standing Committee and voted in 9 members plus 3 alternates. That committee has already met. The next meeting will be held on August 15, 2018 from 9:00 to 11:00 in Auditorium at 850 Foothill in Rialto. It is another Special Meeting so there will be no reports. The

		discussion will be primarily on the recommendations for the Domestic Violence Bonus Project, Bonus Project, and the rating, ranking and tiering. Recommendations will come from the committee to the ICH. The next grant review committee meeting will be held on August 6, 2018.
