In September 2007, the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP) was formed to provide a more focused approach to our goal of ending homelessness within the County. The Partnership consists of city governments, community based organizations, faith-based organizations, educational institutes, non-profit organizations, private industry, and federal, state, and local government.

SBCHP was developed to promote a strong collaboration between agencies to direct the planning, development, and implementation of the County's 10-year-plan to end chronic homelessness. The Partnership meets on the third Wednesday of each month at the Behavioral Health Resource Center in Rialto. The Partnership facilitates better communication, planning, coordination, and cooperation among all entities that provide services and/or resources for the relief of homelessness in San Bernardino County.

Mission Statement

The Mission of the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership is to provide a system of care that is inclusive, well planned, coordinated and evaluated and is accessible to all who are homeless and those at-risk of becoming homeless.

Updates from representatives on progress of regional meetings	<p>Jessica Alexander Central Valley</p> <p>Jimmy Waldron Desert Region</p> <p>Wendell Wilson Mountain</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Our last regular scheduled meeting was well attended. We had a presentation from the Mayor of San Bernardino who presented the cities plan for a wellness center. We also had a great presentation from Dr. Kelley on the what DBH does and the trainings they offer. We are in the process of scheduling some of those trainings for our region. Our new ICH Chair, Maria Razo attended. Currently we are in the process of the HHAP scoring process. We have a great group of dedicated people working on that process. • The Desert HPN hasn't had a chance to meet. We are looking to change the day the HPN meets so it doesn't interfere with other meetings that take place on Tuesdays. We are hoping to get the meetings started up again next month. • I've been busy with the warming center as it transitioned into a 24hr shelter due to Covid-19 and just closed in August. We were able to help house 6-7 veterans through some of our veteran providers. We housed several families and assisted other into various programs. We are looking to find a temporary space for the warming shelter this fall/winter. • At our last HPN meeting we had a presentation on shared housing, which is something The Mountain Homeless Coalition (MHC) is planning on doing with the HHAP funds. MHC has an application in for Homekey, for which we have 6 units in Big Bear and we are looking to add a few manufactured homes to. • The Regional Steering Committee voted to fully fund the MHC's application for the HHAP funds for our region. • We are in the process of hiring a part time case worker/housing navigator that will work along the side of Paul in Big Bear.

	<p>Don Smith West Valley</p> <p>Tom Hernandez Interagency Council on Homelessness (ICH/OHS)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At our last meeting we had a great presentation from Connect Homes, which is a manufactured home developer. They are now manufacturing a shelter product that they are shopping throughout the state. Their manufacturing plant is in San Bernardino, so I encourage anyone considering a manufactured home project to consider Connect Homes. • I'm proud of the coordinating efforts within our region, we have been focusing on prevention and using the Covid funds for that. The City of Montclair has stepped up and hosted the project roomkey for our region. We have had up to two dozen individuals sheltered in the city of Montclair. We have about a dozen left that we are looking into next step solutions for. • OHS is working on HHAP. We are hoping to present recommendations from the regions to ICH on July 28th. If any region needs more time please let OHS know ASAP as we are on a deadline to get the item to ICH. • After speaking with the ICH chair and vice chair, there will be a special meeting called to hold a form 700 workshop for all ICH members more than likely in November. • The CoC's had a conversation with William Snow and it doesn't seem like they will be ready to move forward a HUD CoC Competition this year. There hasn't been any word of any new bonus dollars either. Mr. Snow also mentioned that they have not received any direction for the annual Point In Time Count (PITC) so once there is direction we will notify everyone. • As for Homekey the governor just announced awards for the Homekey projects and we were award funds for the All-Star Lodge Project and Pacific Village. All Star Lodge is a motel conversion of 76 units to Studio and One-Bedroom units with a target population for 55+. Pacific Village is 26 units of extended stay and they are looking to bring on trailers or tiny homes to expand the number of units. The Pacific Village property was a former Salvation Army property.

Permanent Housing	Wendell Wilson	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Housing for the homeless is needed. There has never been enough affordable housing available from government agencies. Smaller non-profits can be part of the solution by purchasing their own properties. This gives them control over what kind of housing they want to provide. Where they want to provide it and to whom they will provide it for. • There are many grants you can apply for that will allow you to purchase properties and rehab them. • You have to do your research. Willing to invest time and put in the effort. • Talk to realtors to gather information on properties and see if there are any programs for non-profits. • If anyone is interested in continuing the discussion of real-estate we can put together some zoom meetings. What do you want to see for the HPN as we look to the future? • I suggest as we gather for our HPN meetings that we take our concerns or suggestions to our Regional Steering Committee Chairs who then can take our suggestions to ICH on our behalf. • I want to piggyback off of Wendell's suggestion as chairs we are the voice of the providers and we can certainly make sure your ideas and concerns are heard at ICH. I want to make sure you know I am available for any of you providers in the Central Valley that have an issue. Please feel free to come to me. • I'm working with a family on the West end that I'm having difficulty assisting as they are undocumented and speak very limited english. Its difficult when paperwork is not in Spanish and they do not understand it. I want to make you all aware of this as we begin to see more undocumented families looking for assistance. • I partner with an agency called Central Imagrante and they do great work with our undocumented population in San Bernardino. I will reach out to them to see if they can provide information or trainings. • Based on activities the homeless providers have been used to in terms of United Way 211and what we provide. The County has been getting us to respond and act within our means of funding, so that means we are not able to provide some of the services we were, like outreach and such. I would like to discuss this with you Ms. Green further at a later date, ways we can still provide those services and provide homeless verifications. • Since Wayne was unable to give an update for the East Valley HPN, at our last meeting they voted to fund Morongo Basin Arch and KEYS for HHAP funding. We have been very active in the basin and have

We have active food drives bringing locally sourced farm to table foods to individuals.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Countywide we have had an increase of about 54%. Ontario Tay is just shy of 100 youth enrolled right now. Our high desert TAY is expanding into Barstow. • San Bernardino TAY is operating virtually as we have loaned the San Bernardino TAY Center to Children and Family Services to uses as a Covid exposed/Covid Positive shelter. So far, we have only had to children referred there. Our youth shelter beds continue to operate and we are at about 80% occupancy. • On a positive note we have 40 youth enrolled in community college. • County Schools are still looking to find ways to open our schools. We have a few that have opened in the desert but all of our other sites are doing distance learning. We continue to provide outreach and mental services to make sure our kids are getting connected to services. We handed out 2400 Kindle fires and 24 pallets of books. I want to thank Julie at HomeAid Inland empire for coming through for our kids this summer. Without their support many of our kids would have went hungry and wouldn't have essentials items they needed. • We are still looking for a temporary location for our warming shelter this season, looking to run November - March. The location needs to be zoned for a shelter which is been an obstacle. • We have been collaborating with other agencies on various projects. We have been working with Project Homekey and provided food for the first 15 families housed in Victorville. We are also looking to purchase property for emergency shelter. We are focusing on prevention services to help individuals from becoming homeless.
