In September 2007, the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP) was formed to provide a more focused approach to our goal of ending homelessness within the County. The Partnership consists of city governments, community based organizations, faith-based organizations, educational institutes, non-profit organizations, private industry, and federal, state, and local government.

SBCHP was developed to promote a strong collaboration between agencies to direct the planning, development, and implementation of the County's 10-year-plan to end chronic homelessness. The Partnership meets on the third Wednesday of each month at the Behavioral Health Resource Center in Rialto. The Partnership facilitates better communication, planning, coordination, and cooperation among all entities that provide services and/or resources for the relief of homelessness in San Bernardino County.

Mission Statement

The Mission of the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership is to provide a system of care that is inclusive, well planned, coordinated and evaluated and is accessible to all who are homeless and those at-risk of becoming homeless.

Call to Order Welcome and Introductions	Don Smith	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The meeting was called to order at 1:08 p.m. Attendees were welcomed to the meeting and asked to introduce themselves.

Updates from representatives on progress of regional meetings	<p>Jessica Alexander Central Valley</p> <p>Jimmy Waldron Desert Region</p> <p>Wayne Hamilton East Valley</p> <p>Wendell Wilson Mountain</p> <p>Don Smith West Valley</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In June Don Smith and Anthony Brazier did a presentation on resource mapping for the Central Valley. Anthony is going to continue this project and collect all the available resources in the region. If you provide resources in the Central Valley and would like to be included on this project please connect with Anthony Brazier. • In May Molina Health Care gave a presentation on Health Homes. It was very informative and we were excited to hear all they are doing. • If you would like to join the Central Valley HPN meetings, we meet the 1st Wednesday of each month 1-3pm at 303 E. Vanderbilt Way, San Bernardino. • Our meeting in June was canceled but we met in May. We were lucky enough to have a preview of the presentation that you are going to see today from NAMI. It was so informative we've also had them present at the shelter. • We have met with the Cities of Hesperia, Apple Valley and Victorville to discuss finding a permanent location for the Warming Shelter, hopefully still on the fairgrounds. Now that three cities are involved getting a location, permits, etc. has become a more challenging process. We are still looking to procure a space for this year's warming shelter, so our opening date may be delayed. If you know of a space that would be willing to rent to us on a temporary basis for the months of November thru March please let me know. • We have a few agencies that have received HEAP funding so they are working on assisting families with homeless prevention and transitional housing. • At our last meeting we discussed the approval to open a day-use drop in center. We are working with the County to go through the process of setting this up. We will provide shelter, food, clothing, hygiene items, and support services to the homeless residents in our community. • We talked about the HEAP grant and how we will be able to hire a full time employee. We also discussed looking for a location to open a cold weather shelter. • At our last meeting we discussed the Multi-Jurisdictional Homeless Action Plan. We reviewed the data from the last workshop and began building strategies to address the issues we are facing in the west

	<p>Tom Hernandez Interagency Council on Homelessness (ICH/OHS)</p>	<p>valley region.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We had a representative from each city in the west valley region so we discussed ideas on how the cities can assist with homeless prevention. • We talked about relaxed zoning laws and coming up with solutions for affordable housing. • We also continued to build our resource inventory for the West Valley region. Our next meeting will be August 4th, 10-12pm at the America's Job center in Rancho Cucamonga. • ICH met on June 26th. You can go to the SBCHP website to see all the reports that were submitted with the agenda. • The Housing Authority showed a quick video on the No Child Left on Sheltered program. There was an update on the Multi-Jurisdictional Homeless Action Plan. • Next Monday, July 15th we will be having the last Multi-Jurisdictional Homeless Action Plan Workshop in preparation for new funding. I encourage everyone to attend. • Dr Middleton gave a presentation on a Free Dental Event taking place September 27-28, 2019 at the National Orange Show Events Center. If you want to know more about this event visit their website at: https://www.cdafoundation.org/cda-cares/san-bernardino. • ICH approved modifications to the City of Redlands HEAP contract. They also approved the recommendations to update the code of conduct policy and to add a grievance policy to the ICH Governance Charter and they elected 7 members to serve as the grant review committee. • CES Written Standards were presented to ICH to adopt but that was not approved. We will discuss this item today and will bring it back to ICH when we have gathered more information. • COC NOFA was released. Our annual renewal amount (ARD) is roughly \$9.7 million. Then there is about \$663,000 for CoC Bonus and \$1.2 million for DV Bonus. The Grant Review Committee will set the criteria and the scoring mechanism. They will have a tight turn around to get everything done, so watch for more information to come on this. • There will be a Special ICH meeting held on July 31, 2019. • Office of Homeless Services is in the process of preparing for the Collaborative CoC Application. We are also in the process of getting the first round of HEAP fund dispersed. We are working on the Housing for a Healthy CA Grant ad will be submitting that on behalf of the County of San Bernardino. We are also working on the Homeless Youth Survey Report.
	<p>Marisela Manzo CoC Coordinated Entry System (CES)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We had our first round of CES workshops and had over 80 people in attendance. We are looking to add more dates and take it on the road so we can reach more people. • On July 19th we will be having an Outreach workshop. You must be able to access HMIS to participate. I'll send out the information on where to register soon. • Within the first 5 days of this month we have already received 138 calls. We have returned around 120 calls and have engaged with 30 individuals. • We are still working out all the kinks with HEAP. If you know how many referrals your agency can take please let us know that information. • We keep looking into impediments and right now the biggest one is housing. The cost of housing has gone up tremendously making it difficult to find affordable housing. In our veterans meeting we have 102 veterans with housing vouchers that we cannot find housing for within their voucher amounts.

Adverse City Housing Zoning Laws	Adrienna Wong	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ms. Wong gave a presentation on Confronting zoning Challenges to Transitional & Supportive Housing. • Common zoning challenges are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Restrictions on location ○ Exclusion from residential zones ○ Special approval processes ○ Conditional use permits ○ Additional building standards and requirements ○ Additional fees • SB 2 Housing Element Law states that transitional and supportive housing must be treated the same as other residential uses. It also states there must be at least one zone where emergency shelter is permitted by right - enough to satisfy unmet need. • SB 2 Housing Accountability Act limits when localities can deny/limit transitional and supportive housing and there must be written reasons for denial and must state a specific, adverse impact upon public health or safety. • There are civil rights protections provided by: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Federal Fair Housing Act ○ CA Fair Employment & Housing Act (FEHA) ○ California Government Code § 65008 ○ California Government Code Section 11135 ○ Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) ○ Rehabilitation Act (RA) • Advocacy is important and should be done at the city & county level with support from state legislation.
National Association on Mental Illness (NAMI)	Barbara Redding	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Barbara Redding and Marie Ballew gave a presentation on the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI). • They showed a brief video about their program. • NAMI provides support and resources for those affected by mental illness. • 1 in 5 adults (43.8 million, or 18.5%) experiences mental illness in a given year. • 1 in 25 adults (10 million, or 4.2%) experiences a serious mental illness that substantially interferes with one or more major life activities. • Serious mental illness costs America \$193.2 billion in lost earnings per year. • Mood disorders, including major depression, dysthymic disorder and bipolar disorder, are the third most common cause of hospitalization for youth and adults aged 18–44. • Only 41% of adults in the U.S. with a mental health condition received mental health services in the past year. • We want to stop the stigma associated with mental illness and provide a safe place for people to talk about it.
